OBJECT TO SALE OF DREADNAUGHT

Deputies Say Brazil has Made Mistake

RIO DE JANEIRO, via GALVESTON, TEXAS, Oct. 22, (Special)—The Chamber of Deputies again discussed the sale of the dreadnaught Rio de Janeiro.

Senhor Luciano Pereira blamed the government for the sale, saying it would put Brazil in the second rank among the naval Powers of South America.

The newspaper O Noite says the price of the sale should be appropriated to the building of a new and more modern dreadnaught.

It is rumored the dreadnaught will be purchased by Canada, as well as the Chilean battleships, the Almirante Latorre and the Almirante Cochrane.

LITHGOW SAYS WILL BE FOUR TEAM LEAGUE

J. C. Lithgow, in a letter to a friend in Sydney referred interestingly to the coming hockey season. While regretting the forced retirement of Moncton from the league due to the destruction of their rink last winter by fire, he intimated that a four-team league would be most satisfactory to all the teams concerned.

This four-team league would include Halifax Socials and Crescents, New Glasgow and Sydney.

In the matter of a New Glasgow team there has been very little done in that town this season, and a rumor was current a few days ago that there might not be a team from that town this season. It is known that several of their last year's players were looking for berths with other teams, and it was probably this that gave rise to the rumor that New Glasgow would be out of the game the coming winter.

However, the league will meet very soon and the question of how many teams are to play professional hockey will be decided.

NO ALUM PORTUGAL DRIFTS TOWARDS CRISIS

London Correspondent Points Gloomy Picture

LONDON, Oct. 22, (Special)—A gloomy picture of conditions in Portugal is painted by the Daily Express' special correspondent in Lisbon.

"After three years of so called republicanism, the people of Portugal," he says, "are wondering whether they were not better off under the somewhat corrupt monarchy. Bitter disillusionment has succeeded the optimism with which they acclaimed the new era of self-government.

"Affairs are drifting to another national crisis in which the syndicalists and monarchist and opportunist politicians contend for the supremacy and the condition of Portugal may be much worse before it is better."

ETIQUETTE OF WEDDINGS

There should be no very grave questions arise when the solemn ceremony of marriage is to be just the simple hour affair, yet I receive so many queries concerning this that I shall try to give my views as to the "proper things" to do on such occasions.

Simplicity is the keynote of good taste; if not really simple the idea is implied, and where a small home wedding is to be celebrated there can be nothing more elegant than just simplicity. The bride may be simply gowned, although this depends upon her individual taste, many young women feeling that so important an event demands all possible elegance of dress. Yet, I think these are in the minority, if a home wedding is purposely selected.

It is entirely appropriate for bride and groom to enter together, she leaning upon his left arm as they stand in that way before the improvised altar, just a plain table covered with a snowy cloth, a vase of blossoms, a prayer book and a Bible set upon it. The minister can take his position near this when told of the approach of the couple, and there need be no attendants. The bride may wear her travelling gown and hat, and the groom a travelling suit, with tie to match the gown worn by his bride. Such a wedding with only relatives and close friends in the room is an ideal home affair, and may take place any time before 6 o'clock in the evening. After that the bridegroom should wear full evening dress, and the bride may wear the traditional white of it be the simplest gown of lawn and lace.

A more elaborate affair calls for a maid of honor, a bridesmaid and the "best-man," who is a great help to the minister and the bridegroom, awaits the bride with her attendants, who then enters with her father or nearest male relative; they meet at the altar, and the best man stands to the right hand and in the rear of his principal to have the ring in readiness. It is he that sees to carriages, fee for the officiating minister, attends to the wants of guests, etc. An out-of-door wedding is easily managed if the weather can be depended upon, a carpet is spread for the bride to stand on, and the ceremony should take place early in the afternoon and where there are blossoming trees.

A bride who is in mourning may don all white for her wedding, veil and the precious accessories. A satin or ivory-bound prayer book, a spray of blossoms marking the marriage service, is always in good taste.
