**LEAVES FOR WEST.**—Mr. E. H. Monkley, of Summerside left on Thursday for Ottawa. We understand that Mr. Monkley has been offered the appointment of Fox Inspector for one of the Western provinces.

**NEW TRUSTEES OF FALCONWOOD.**—At a meeting of the Government on Friday the following trustees of Falconwood were appointed:—Premier Stewart, chairman; Hous. J. A. MacDonald, J. H. Myers, Dr. W. J. P. McMillan and Mr. L. L. Jenkins and Mr. Hugh Connors.

**LOCATED AT STANLEY BRIDGE.**—Dr. J. R. Mathieson, who has lately returned from England, has decided to locate at Stanley Bridge, for the practice of medicine. The doctor is a graduate of McGill University and for some years after graduation practiced at Prince Albert. At the opening of the Great War he enlisted as Medical Officer to the First Canadian Siege and continued on active service till the end of the war. For the present he has opened offices at the residence of Mr. Bennett, Stanley Bridge.

**VISIT OF BOY SCOUT OFFICIAL.**—Mr. H. Lister, field executive of the Dominion Boy Scout Headquarters, Ottawa, is in the city, the guest at the Queen Hotel. Mr. Lister intends to spend three or four weeks on the Island in the interest of Boy Scout organization work. He wishes to meet all young men interested in this work. In conversation with Mr. Lister the Guardian learns that the Scout movement, of which Governor General Lord Byng is the Canadian head, is making big progress in all the provinces. It is confidently expected that Mr. Lister's visit here will increase the interest and enthusiasm in the work.

**TRAFFIC ACCIDENT.**—A traffic accident occurred Friday evening when a motor truck trailing a ladder tripped up a little girl, and injured her to the extent of having her confined to bed. Little Louise Arsenault, 13 years, while crossing the corner of Kent and Great George Street, accompanied by two ladies, was passed by an auto truck. A trailing ladder knocked the little girl down. She was carried into her home nearby and a doctor was summoned who fortunately found no bones broken. The number of the truck has been reported to the police.

**FACTORY DESTROYED.**—A bad fire which broke out at the lobster factory at Campbellton, near Bloomfield, completely destroyed the building. The factory was owned by Mr. J. P. Thompson.

**GRANT TO G. W. V. A. . .** At the recent meeting of the Government a grant of \$500 was made the G. W. V. A. in connection with the expenses incurred welcoming the Governor General to the Province.

**GOVERNMENT OFFICES ABOLISHED.**—At a meeting of the Government on Friday it was decided to abolish the positions of Assistant Provincial Engineer and Messenger.

**OLD TUG SCRAPPED.**—The old tug Weatherspoon, is no more. This boat has been employed at Borden for some time. Tuesday night she sprang a leak and the incoming waters quenched the fires leaving her helpless. In this condition she was beached and is now broken up.

**ENGAGEMENT ANNOUNCED.**—Dr. Alexander Ross and Mrs. Ross announce the engagement of their daughter, Margaret Myrtle, to Mr. John W. MacLeod, B. Sc., of New Glasgow, N.S. The marriage to take place in Montreal, early in October.

**VISITED N. S. AND P. E. I.**—Mr. F. J. Gemmill Smith, publicity agent of the C. N. R. in London, who is making a tour of the Maritime Provinces, returned to Moncton from points in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, accompanied by Mr. A. H. Lindsay, publicity agent of the railway here. Mr. Gemmill-Smith who proceeded to St. John, intends leaving today for Montreal. Moncton Times.

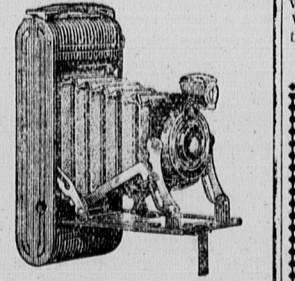
