FOREIGN IMMIGRATION TO CANADA.

A recent Dominion Bluebook shows that in the course of last year 25,731 foreigners in Canada swore allegiance to the King and the Canadian constitution. The number may seem small compared with the volume of immigration, but is not really so when some facts are explained.

Here again it is to be observed that a considerable number of the settlers coming to the Northwest are returning Canadians who had not lost their Canadian citizenship, not having taken the oath of allegiance to the United States.

RECIPROCITY AND ANNEXATION

A good deal of foolishness is appearing in some of the protectionist organs as to the danger of reciprocity bringing in a movement in favor of annexation.

LOW PRICE POSSIBILITIES.

While all over the world there is complaint of the high prices of food and other necessities of life, it is quite astonishing at what low rates these can be provided on a large scale.

Reciprocity was brought on by treaty in 1854 and instead of furthering the annexation movement it effectually killed it.

It maintains eleven restaurants and eating rooms, four coffee kitchens, one portable kitchen, one store for the sale of various provisions, two lunch rooms and one lecture or meeting hall.

The McKinley tariff was another move to drive Canada to do what she did not want to do, and it signally failed.

Last year 475,000 cups of coffee were supplied at 1 2-5 cents a cup; more than 500,000 cups of milk at 1 3-5 cents a cup and 20,000 cups of cocoa and chocolate at 2 2-5 cents a cup.

We have spoken of this talk about reciprocity leading to annexation as foolishness. It is really something worse than that. It is dishonest.

A well cooked and ample dinner, consisting of soup, meat vegetables, including potatoes, is served for 3-10 cents. Single portions of meat or vegetables can be had at equally low rates.

The death of J. J. Chappell of the P. E. Island Railway which occurred yesterday morning, was not unexpected as he had been for a long time seriously ill.

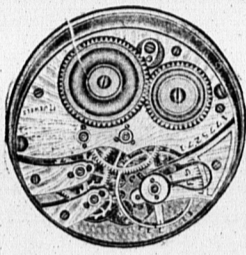
He was always moderate but earnest in his advocacy of reform, holding that "unwavering fidelity is a better advocate than violent denunciation."

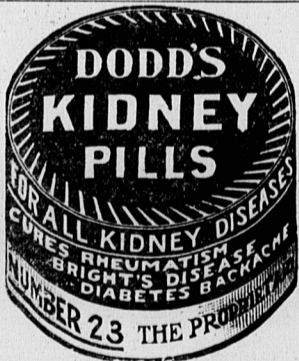
