STRIKE OR WALKOUT CONTEMPLATED BY BALL PLAYERS.

NEW YORK, July 23.—Drastic action, possibly a strike or walkout of baseball players in the American and National Leagues, is contemplated by the Baseball Players' Fraternity, according to a statement by President Fultz, in case the National Commission refuses to accede to the terms of an ultimatum sent in by the Fraternity recently in the case of player Kraft, of the Newark Internationalists.

Mr. Fultz declined to make public the terms of the ultimatum, but said he would issue a statement outlining it later in the day. It was reported that the commission had been given until July 22 to reply to the players' demands. In the event of an unfavorable or unsatisfactory reply, Mr. Fultz said the Players' Fraternity would take "drastic action." Mr. Fultz was unwilling to say what the nature of the action would be.

KILLS EIGHT RATTLESNAKES

MIDDLETOWN, N. Y., July 23.—Frank Woolsey, clerk in a Brooklyn store, who has been spending the past few days at a Sullivan County resort, had a very exciting experience with rattlesnakes on Sunday, when he was out for a stroll on the mountain, in company with George Davids, a friend from Manhattan.

The young men had remarked that during their stay in the mountains, they had not seen a rattlesnake, when they were started to discover one crossing their path, a short distance ahead. Davids jumped back with a warning cry to Woolsey to

beware of his danger. The latter, however, proceeded to "get the snake," which he accomplished with a few well-directed blows and then proceeded to hunt more. He soon found that they were plentiful, and in less than half an hour had killed eight good-sized rattlers. Woolsey carried the collection of dead snakes to his boarding house, where they were skinned and the pelts will be taken back to Brooklyn.

Dean Abbott before coming to Hamilton was curate of St. James Cathedral, Montreal. For the last seven and a half years he has held the rectorship of the Cathedral here. He is a brilliant speaker. The Cleveland appointment carries with it a salary of \$6,000 and house. Dean Abbott is a native of Hamilton.
