THE LONG SHOULDER.

Cape and Sleeve Effects Which Accentuate This.
One of the leading fashion notes of the season is the return of the pelerine, or cape. Lovers of the old masters are chiefly responsible for this revival of the long shoulder and the cape collar. The leading dressmakers today can adapt any fashion to the wearer; consequently there is no suggestion of dowdiness about the pelerine of the hour. From an economical point of view this is an excellent way of renovating a last year's coat or blouse and of using sale remnants of lace or embroidery. Irish crochet lace is being made in ecru and cream, as the all white was

found very trying. For mixing with cloth linen—and, indeed, velvets and satin—there is nothing smarter than this heavy make of lace. The picture frock can adapt itself to many occasions by the addition of fitch or long or short coat of lace. The loose little coats known last year as "Frocks and Frills" are to be revived with more elaborate effects. The difference is felt mainly in the sleeves, which are draped and caught up in becoming manner. Capes which in no way resemble the unbecoming affairs which were formerly known by that name are made with shawl effects and long, pendent ends. FASHION NOTES.

The New Figure—The Sack Coat Even Popular.
For some long time we have fitted our hips even more closely and carefully than our waists, and the wasplike figure is no longer modish. Straight front corsets have made a small waist impossible, and the fashionable figure is more nearly a natural one than it has been for many years. The straight front corset has not only altered the shape of the gown, but it has seriously affected the style and trimming of underwear. For instance, the sack shape chemise is most desirable, as it gives a straight front, but the yoke and trimming must be arranged quite deep, or there is a big expanse of untrimmed cambric between the very low corset and the small old fashioned square or yoke. The sack coatee will be the model for spring wear, and plaits, tucks or

holds will be seen on all coats, whether long or short. The tailor delights in flat plaits, and this season he has full scope for elaboration in this form. All folds must be sharp and clear and thoroughly pressed, and pressing in tailor fashion is quite an art, as the folds are practically indestructible. There is a possibility that accordion plaited skirts will return and a certainty that tucks will stay in style. On the new cloth gowns there is a trimming running up and down between the tucks, and very often this trimming is handsome and elaborate, though very narrow. SMART MILLINERY.

Becoming Shapes For Dressy and Ordinary Wear.
The new hat shapes are decidedly becoming and artistic. The chief characteristic consists in a clinging effect in the back and a shovel effect in front. Hats entirely composed of flowers have upturned brims and for sole trimming a big bow of velvet. The flat aigret is one of the most popular trimmings. It is placed at the

left side of a rough straw turban in such a manner that it projects slightly in advance of the hat. Double faced hats, the upper part being white and the under black, are very becoming and smart. Shapes of black chiffon trimmed with a single ostrich feather are both becoming and useful. Hydrangeas and jonquils are among the novelties in artificial flowers. In general the trimmings may be said to be, if anything, flatter than ever, but the outlines of the hat are more raised. The tailor made hat of the season is much more becoming than formerly, for instead of the universal sailor shape an unusual variety of modes are shown, all of them with rolling or irregular brims and flat or round crowns. With an aigret or a smart bow of ribbon, the trimming is complete, and this can easily be contrived by the woman with a little skill in her fingers. MONTREAL, May 15.—Forty-seven Englishmen, brought from England by the Canadian Pacific, having refused to work since the settlement of the strike, were arrested today. In court they pleaded not guilty and were remanded. The men were brought there under contract.

TORONTO TRAMWAY STRIKE.

TORONTO, May 15.—A street railway strike appears probable, as all negotiations looking to a settlement have failed. The men demand recognition of the union and pay at the rate of 21 and 23 cents. The present rate is 18 cents, and for men over two years employed 20 cents. The men are to hold a mass meeting on Saturday night to discuss a strike.
