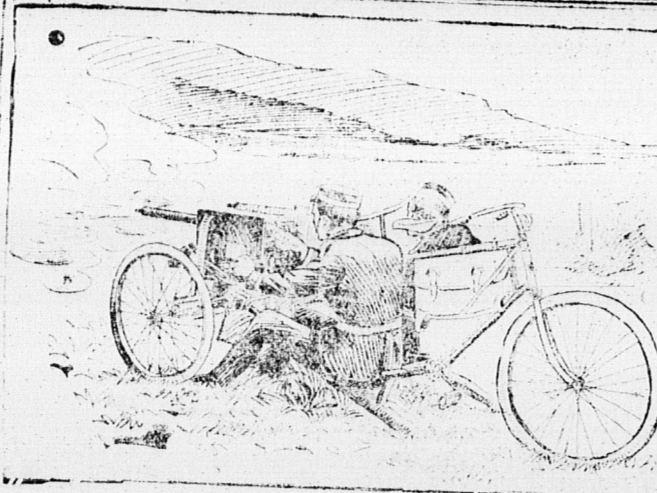

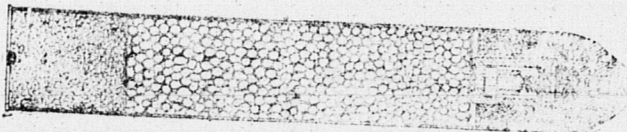



DISCUSS SUBJECT OF DIFFERENTIALS

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Feb. 1.—At the meeting yesterday of the executive committees of the trunk line association with representatives of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company, to consider the Canadian Pacific New Haven differential, the whole matter was gone over in some detail, no decision reached with the understanding that another meeting of the executive committee will be called within thirty days for further discussion. In the meanwhile there is to be held at Boston a meeting of representatives of the New England interests connected with the differential, which involves not merely the New Haven and the Boston and Maine, but the Grand Trunk and boat lines with southern through connections. In the mean- while the differential covering the New Haven system and giving all the con- nections between New York and the West over the New Haven and Can- adian Pacific is continued. There ap- pears to be no disposition on the part of the New Haven to make any change in favor of the differential.

He was 69 years old and has been in the service since 1877. A CONFLAGRATION IN HALIFAX CITY
