TEHERAN, Oct. 26.—The Shah of Persia escaped uninjured when an automobile which was escorting him on a tour of the province of Masandaran was blown up near Damavand. Several officers were killed and two injured. The automobile blown up was carrying arms ammunition and bombs but the cause of the explosion has not been exchanged. The injured and bodies of the dead have been brought to Teheran. The Shah continued his tour.
