### WILL BUILD STEEL SHIPS AT PICTOU

#### Three 4,700-ton Freighters to be Opening program

#### Will Mean Revival Of Industry Dormant In Nova Scotia For Years.

HALIFAX, Oct. 7—(CP)—An announcement that Nova Scotia will build three 4,700-ton freighters at Pictou will mean a revival of an industry dormant in Nova Scotia for many years and, the announcement said, will "place Nova Scotia in the forefront of the shipbuilding activities in Canada." Up to now, Nova Scotian yards have been building for wartime purposes fast patrol boats, minesweepers and small harbor craft. All have been of wooden construction.
