The death took place in Cambridge, Mass., on March 14th, of Peter F. McAuley formerly of Prince Edward Island.

As the steamer Stanley is now running regularly Messrs Davis and Frasers' buyers will purchase pork as usual in the past.

The nurses of the P. E. Island Hospital in uniform attended the funeral services of the late Dr. R. Johnson, both at the house and church yesterday afternoon.

The mail reached the City yesterday at 4.15. There were no boats at Cape Tormentine yesterday morning; those on the Traverse side made the round trip. Another set of crews also crossed to adjust the service and there are now boats on both sides.

HON. J. H. CUMMIACKY, Commissioner of Public Works left last night for Cape Traverse and will cross by the Cape today en route to Quebec. The Commissioner goes to that city for the purpose of ascertaining the suitability of a steamer which will likely be placed on the Belfast-Cape and Charlottetown routes in place of the ill-fated Jacques Cartier. It will be remembered that tenders were called for some time ago by the Government for a steamer and the tender from the Company owning this steamer has been the most favorably considered. Her name is the City of London and she has been plying on the St. Lawrence between Quebec and Montreal. She is a propeller boat of slightly larger tonnage than the Cartier, draws about the same depth of water and is several knots faster. She is about twelve years old. The action of the Government in thus placing an up-to-date steamer on the service will be appreciated by the people of those sections as well as by many citizens who enjoy an excursion during the hot summer months.

ST. CROIX COTTON STRIKE.
