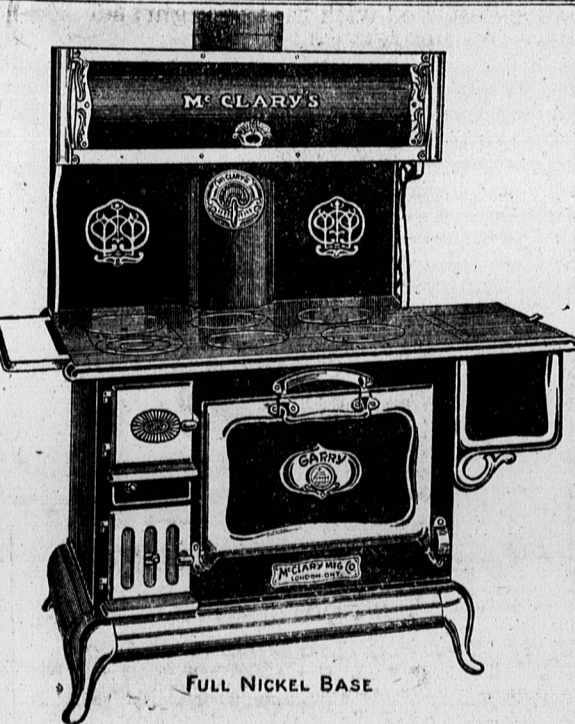

willing to stand and be judged by them. While we are willing to give him full credit for honesty both of purpose and conviction, it is a mystery to us how he can maintain a clean conscience, and still continue in his present political companionship. Of course we do not all take our observations through the same glasses, and due allowance must be made for political bias and the influence of environment, but even with all this there is a point to which a person cannot reach with safety to his reputation and it appears to us that the honorable gentleman has overstepped the safety mark. However he is with the combination, whether as a chief actor or otherwise, and it is a matter for his own conscience which we must leave to himself and the determination of his constituents.

In dealing with the management of his department he had some statements to make that will come very strongly into conflict with the dictates of common sense. When a public man, for instance claims to have purchased more goods and at a higher price than was purchased and paid for by his predecessor,

AND DID IT WITH LESS MONEY, he lays himself open to suspicion that is not altogether too healthy for his reputation in fairness to his opponents, and common honesty to the people. Yet this was the whole gist of his argument in relation to Falconwood Hospital and Infirmary. And there was not an item of expenditure or purchase instanced for illustration, nothing in the world but his bare ipsi dixit. And when he declared that he found the "Falconwood conditions exceedingly bad, and they would have to spend a LARGE AMOUNT to put it in a decent condition", he rather carelessly overlooked the story which the Public Accounts would tell. For those accounts have declared, either that this "LARGE" expenditure was not required, or if required then the Government NEGLECTED TO RESPOND TO THE NEED, and the same "BAD" conditions must still exist, that is if there was such a thing as "bad conditions" at all.

It would not be playing his party's game, but it would be much more consistent with the personal honesty which we have given Mr. Crosby credit for, to have admitted the real fact, that the institutions had been kept in that unusual good state of repair that when the Bell Government assumed charge, only a minimum of expenditure was necessary, such as is required in the case of all property, public and private, was called for in 1920. In stead of leaving the impression with the people that they were buying food at higher prices, and yet getting it for less money, the more manly course would have been to say that they had 350 barrels of flour worth about \$4,000, 5,000 pounds of meat worth at their own figures \$1,000 and \$3,000 excess of other stocks—a total of \$8,000—left to them by the Arsenal Government, which they did not have to buy in the year 1920. He

did admit \$3,000 worth of plumbing supplies and an expensive boiler charged up to the late Government and handed over to them. And yet, relieved of all these expenditures, aggregating about \$10,000 his expenditure for the year actually exceeded that of his predecessors whose record he attempted so unfairly to prejudice.

- STEWED RAISINS: Cover Sun-Maid Raisins with cold water and add a slice of lemon or orange to each half pound. Place on fire; bring to a boil and allow to simmer for one hour. Sugar may be added, but is not necessary, as Sun-Maid Seeded Raisins contain 75% percent natural fruit sugar. Serve with or without cream. RAISIN RICE PUDDING: 1/2 cup Sun-Maid Seeded Raisins; 1-2 cup rice; 1/2 cup sugar; 3 cups milk; 1 cup water; 2 eggs; 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg (may omit).
