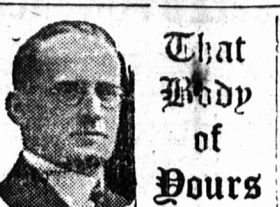
HOUSEHOLD SCRAP BOOK By Roberta Lee Tan Shoes When tan shoes are badly soiled or spotted, place on a shoe tree and wash with a flannel cloth squeezed out of white soap suds.

Muffin Batter Muffin batter can be mixed and set in the ice box until time to bake. If one wishes to make it ahead of time, the cold air prevents the leavening from working too soon.

Bedspreads Figured muslins or chintz bedspreads wear well, require less laundering than plain white spreads, and also aid in carrying out a color scheme.

Get the cold frame organized for winter. Put some parsley plants in it for winter garnish, a clump of chives for seasoning, and pansies for occasional bloom.

Set perennials that got a late start from seed in the frame. They may be induced to grow to blooming size in this way.

Appendicitis is a public health problem because the public need to be told of the early symptoms so that they may promptly secure proper treatment which will greatly reduce the present death-rate from this disease.

In the majority of cases, appendicitis causes a condition that a physician will readily diagnose. Pain towards the centre of the abdomen, followed by nausea and vomiting, is usually the first symptom.

There is one thing in particular that will do a tremendous amount of harm and that will, in many cases greatly lessen or take away the chance of recovery, and that is the use of a purgative or laxative.
