### FIND \$14 FOR ROUGH HOCKEY PLAYING

WINDSOR, January 7.—The trial of "Mike" Murphy, the New Glasgow player arrested here Monday night for unlawfully assaulting Frank Brown was held at eleven o'clock Tuesday morning before Justice Curry.
