 MONTRÉAL, Sept. 16.—Cheese and potato prices advanced on the Montreal dairy and produce market today while eggs and butter held unchanged.
 The cheese market was 1/2 to 3/4 cent higher today than last week's closing levels, no 1 Ontario becoming 12 to 12 1/2 cents a pound while no 1 Quebec sold at 11 1/2 to 11 3/4 cents. Toronto, potato prices moved up five to 20 cents per 90-pound bag, but no 1 grade butter continued at 23 cents a pound for solids and 24 1/2 cents for prints.
 Even though declines in the list of market grades were noted at 33 to 34 cents a pound, 23 to 24 cents for B and 20 to 20 1/2 cents for C.

OLD SALTS SCAN GIFT SEA PICTURE AND GIVE PALM TO BLUESEAS PHOTO

NEW YORK, Sept. 14.—About 150 salt-bitten seafaring men sat quietly today and watched Mrs. Jeanette B. Irving, of Gloucester, Mass., unveil a picture of Gloucester Harbour she had painted especially for the Sailors' Sun Harbor on Staten Island.
 For some minutes they peered fixedly at the canvas, whispering a bit as they walked closer.
 As Captain William MacLean tipped to a photograph he had of Nova Scotia schooner Bluenose, showing lanes a-like.
 Mrs. Irving's picture showed fishing vessels which the Sun Harbor viewers described as the "Eyetalian type" with auxiliary motors and a negligible quantity of sail.
 The Bluenose—"there's as fine a sailing craft as ever man laid eyes on," proclaimed Captain MacLean with plenty of accent.
 Back in the main salon looking at the newly-acquired picture Captain John Lee, who sailed out of Gloucester for 25 years was the first to speak. Looking over his shoulder to make sure Mrs. Irving was out of earshot, he pointed a wrinkled hand at a rowboat in the foreground and whispered, "That dory don't look natural."
 The salty are critics lapsed into a discussion of the fishing vessels in the painting.
 "They don't look any more like the vessels we had way back than I look like a monkey," Captain Bruce Porper said convincingly.
 "The ones we sailed in carried a main's' fore's' and three jibs and a stays' and two top's. All these Eyetalian boats carry is a main's' fore's' and one jib, and that's just to keep 'em from rollin'." They got to have them spars to hoist the fish out."
 Captain MacLean brought up his picture of the famed Bluenose. He offered it for comparison. The "There's one that can git." "That's a hound."
