THE EXPRESS.—The express arrived in Charlottetown last night at 11.20.

DOCKED ON TIME.—The S. S. Northumberland docked in Charlottetown last night at 8 o'clock, on time.

AUTOMOBILE OWNERS.—Among those stated to have acquired automobiles in the paragraph appearing in yesterday's Guardian, the name of Mr. H. Horne was erroneously included instead of that of Mr. S. A. McDonald.

REMAINS ARRIVE.—The body of the late Mr. Theophilus Moore, who died in South Bend, Indiana, on September first, arrived in Charlottetown by the express last night. The remains were accompanied by Dr. E. P. Moore, son of the deceased.

PUBLIC MEETING.—A public meeting under the auspices of the Eastern branch of the Teachers Institute, will be held in the School at Almira Sept. 12th, 1913, at 8 o'clock p.m.

AUTOS BRING BUSINESS.—At the meeting held on the lawn of the Cliff Hotel on Wednesday in connection with the automobile picnic given to the farmers of the Union Road Mr. J. Davies, Jr., the proprietor of the Cliff, who was one of the speakers, gave some interesting information with regard to the effect which the running of an automobile has had on the business of the establishment.

GRATIFYING.—In a brief chat yesterday with a Guardian representative with regard to the state of the health of the city, Dr. H. D. Johnston, the Health Officer of Charlottetown, made the interesting and gratifying statement that the health conditions were eminently satisfactory.

WHOSE FAULT?—Shortly before half-past one o'clock yesterday afternoon, the fire alarm bell rang out its portentous message, and in prompt response the Fire Brigade with their hose carts, reels, ladders, and other appliances, went tearing down the street with a crowd of people, young and old, in attendance on them, as usual.

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ROAD IMPROVEMENT.—The farmers of the Union Road, along which the automobiles are allowed to run while they have no objection to those vehicles are combined in their desire to see the road widened and otherwise improved.

OF SPECIAL INTEREST

BERLIN, Aug. 12 (Special)—The great scandal connected with the allegations made some years ago against Prince Philip zu Eulenburg and other men once members of Emperor William's suite has been revived by proceedings brought against a sensational weekly newspaper, the Montags Zeitung.

The newspaper had printed an article connecting the name of Count Georg von Huelens-Haeseler, director of the Royal theatres, with the case. In referring to a story, since denied, of his approaching retirement the newspaper published on August 4 a long attack, alluding to Count von Huelens-Haeseler as a bosom friend of Prince zu Eulenburg and declaring he only narrowly missed being involved in the scandal.

Count von Huelens-Haeseler, who was on a yachting trip with the Emperor at the time the attack appeared, lodged a complaint with the police on his return.

The police searched the newspaper offices and the editor's residence and seized some manuscripts, but did not find the editor, who had left Berlin.

CHRISTIANA, AUG. 9 (Special)—A further mishap in connection with the ill-fated Schroeder-Stranz Arctic expedition was reported in a telegram which reached here announcing the sinking of the cutter Loeven-skold, which set out to the relief of Lieutenant Schroeder-Stranz and his party. Many members of the expedition disappeared in Spitzbergen and some are known to have perished.

The members of the Norwegian relief expedition on board the Loeven-skold, commanded by Captain Lerner and comprising five German explorers and a crew of eight sailors, are continuing the search in the ship's small boats and on sleds. They have found no traces of the missing explorer or his companions.

Captain Staxrud, the Norwegian leader of the other relief expedition, sent a wireless despatch to the Foreign Office here yesterday reporting he had found no trace of Schroeder-Stranz in Northwest Land. He said he was about to proceed across the ice and the land from William I. Island to Green Bay.

Lieutenant Schroeder-Stranz, with three companions, left the other members of his party last year to make a practice trip on sledges across Northeast Land, and they have not been heard of since.

RIO JANEIRO, via GALVESTON, TEXAS, Sept. 3, (Special)—The Chamber of Deputies discussed Prince Luis of Braganza's manifesto yesterday and resolved to publish in the records of Congress the manifesto of the republicans issued in 1880. This is regarded as a reply to the utterances of the pretender.

The Argentine writer Senor Don Manuel Ugarte, interviewed yesterday declared he regards it the task of his life to call the attention of Latin America to the danger of American imperialism. He contemplates the issuance of a Latin-American review after his return to Buenos Ayres.
