Validity Of Act Challenged

OTTAWA, Oct. 15-(CP)—Validity of the Saskatchewan Farm Security Act was challenged in the Supreme Court of Canada today by Hon. J. L. Ralston, counsel for the Dominion Mortgage and Investment Company, as hearings on the constitutionality of the legislation began.

Col. Ralston, former Defence Minister, argued that a section of the act was ultra vires. In that he deals with interest, bankruptcy and insolvency, matters which came under Federal jurisdiction.

The section referred to provides that in any year in which a farmer's crop yield is less than \$6 per acre, the principal owing on all mortgages shall be reduced by the amount of interest due.

Col. Ralston, who will continue his arguments tomorrow, said the Saskatchewan Act would interfere with and obstruct the operations of federal legislation passed to cover cases of bankruptcy and insolvency.

Under the Saskatchewan legislation, a board would be established to rule in cases where a farmer claimed that his returns were less than \$6 per acre. That board, said Col. Ralston, was unconstitutional in that it would be given judicial powers which a legislature did not have the power to confer on a board of the kind.
