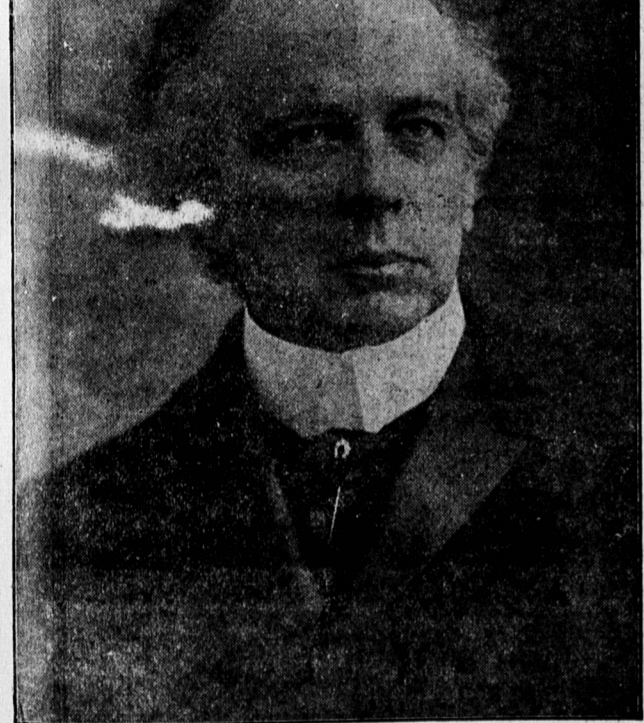

MAINE HAS A BIG POTATO CROP

HOULTON, Me., Oct. 12.—Aroostook county faces the most rosy outlook in its history. Already returns from the potato crop are coming in and everything indicates that this season will be one of the most profitable ever enjoyed.

While it is generally conceded that the acreage of potatoes is not so large as in 1906, it is believed that the yield per acre is the largest average ever obtained. In 1907 the acreage was also a record breaker, but the weather conditions were so disastrous that many potatoes rotted and froze in the ground, which reduced the entire output.
