

SHERLOCK HOLMES HAS BEEN ROBBED.

LONDON, Feb. 5.—A story of how Sir A. Conan Doyle, J. M. Barrie, E. W. Hornung and other play-wrights were defrauded of large amounts due them as royalties was related today before Justice Warrington in an action involving the estate of Addison Bright, a dramatic authors' agent. Bright died in May, 1906.

An investigation ensued in which Barrie and Doyle took part, which resulted in the discovery that Bright had fraudulently retained \$140,000. Of this sum \$80,000 was due to Barrie, \$40,000 to Doyle and the rest to Hornung, all of which has since been paid by Bright's executors.

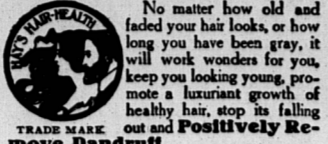

WILL MAKE LOANS TO FLOOD VICTIMS.

PARIS, Feb. 5.—The height of the water at midnight at Pont Royal was 27 feet 3 inches, a fall of nearly four feet from the highest point. The flood continues to drop at the rate of about three-quarters of an inch an hour.

Premier Briand has instructed the prefects to make a complete inventory of the flooded areas and to appraise the individual losses, after which Parliament will be asked for new credits in connection with the measures of relief.

Soldiers are still guarding many of the public buildings, and strong detachments have been sent to the various outlying districts to stop the wholesale pillage which is still going on.

A boat patrol surprised a band of Apaches robbing a villa tonight at Boulogne-Sur-Seine. After a chase, in which a fusillade was exchanged, an infantry sergeant sank the robbers' boat with a blow of an oar. Two of the Apaches were killed and the others were captured.

The government is carrying into effect measures to enable the small proprietors in Paris and throughout the flooded districts to re-establish themselves by means of loans, and to furnish work for the victims.

The city council, following the lead of the national government, is arranging, with the co-operation of the savings institutions, to furnish money for the re-building of stores and houses and the re-furnishing of supplies.

The general government has decided upon a general scheme of employment whereby, by those who desire work may find it in repairing the roads and the public buildings throughout the devastated territory.

The municipal council has adopted the suggestion of presenting medals to those who have been conspicuous in the rescue work. These medals will bear the inscription, "Eminent Nec Mergitur," which is the motto of Paris.

Some difficulty is being experienced in restraining the residents of the flooded districts from returning to their homes immediately on the recession of the water, without waiting for the disinfection of the premises.

The foreign office is now free of water, but is without gas, electricity, telegraph or telephone service. The students residing in the Latin quarter have formed a relief society and have agreed to care for their few American comrades who suffered in any way in connection with the flood.

In addition to \$50,000 received from Massachusetts, new subscriptions to the relief fund from the United States are as follows: French colony of New York, \$4,000; French colony of San Francisco, \$10,000; American Red Cross, \$5,000; W. K. Vanderbilt, \$20,000; Mrs. A. D. Huntington, \$5,000.

HAMILTON, Ont., Feb. 5.—Robert Neville, who was frightfully burned during a quarrel with his wife, after a spree a week ago, is dying in the City Hospital. The authorities say he cannot live more than a few hours. His wife is under arrest, charged with throwing a lighted lamp at her husband.

Magistrate Jelis, Chief Smith, and a stenographer went to the hospital to take the dying man's ante-mortem statement, but he was too weak to talk.

Mrs. Neville alleges that her husband tried to cut her throat, and in the scuffle the lamp exploded. Neville was formerly a well known commercial traveler, and his wife is well connected in the old country, her people sending her remittances regularly.
