

FIND WEST KEEN FOR MILITARY TRAINING

OTTAWA, Nov. 15.—Hon. Sam Hughes, minister of militia, and General Mackenzie, chief of the general staff, have returned from visits of inspection in the west as far as the Pacific Coast.

Throughout the west, Col. Hughes and Gen. Mackenzie were impressed with the keen military spirit and enthusiasm shown. They also had numerous opportunities of observing the remarkable good effect from a national view of the formation of militia corps.

A difficulty which was brought to Gen. Mackenzie's attention was horse supply. The department has been organizing militia in the west on a proportion roughly of two mounted men to one infantryman; but with the change in condition the saddle horse is being replaced by the draught horse.

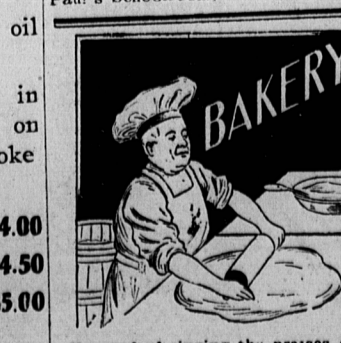

The following, taken from the Montreal Star, will be of interest in this Province: "Prices on turkeys are easier today and are likely to be much lower in a week or ten days. Advertisers from the country say supplies are larger than a year ago and that contracts have been made with local butchers to supply their wants at 17c. per pound, a decline of three cents from the present quotations which are 18 and 20 cents.

In view of the fact that 35 cents for turnips and 55 cents per bushel is being asked for potatoes sold at the wharves here, the following taken from Saturday's Charlottetown Examiner, will prove of interest to local consumers. "L. Wood returned last evening from Sydney where he had been looking over the discharging of schooners John Halifax, Joseph McGill, Pacific, Hector McGregor and Carrie, laden with Island produce. Mr. Wood reports that the market in Sydney is pretty well gutted. The price now ruling there are, potatoes 45c; oats 52c; hay \$15 and turnips 25c.—North Sydney Herald.
