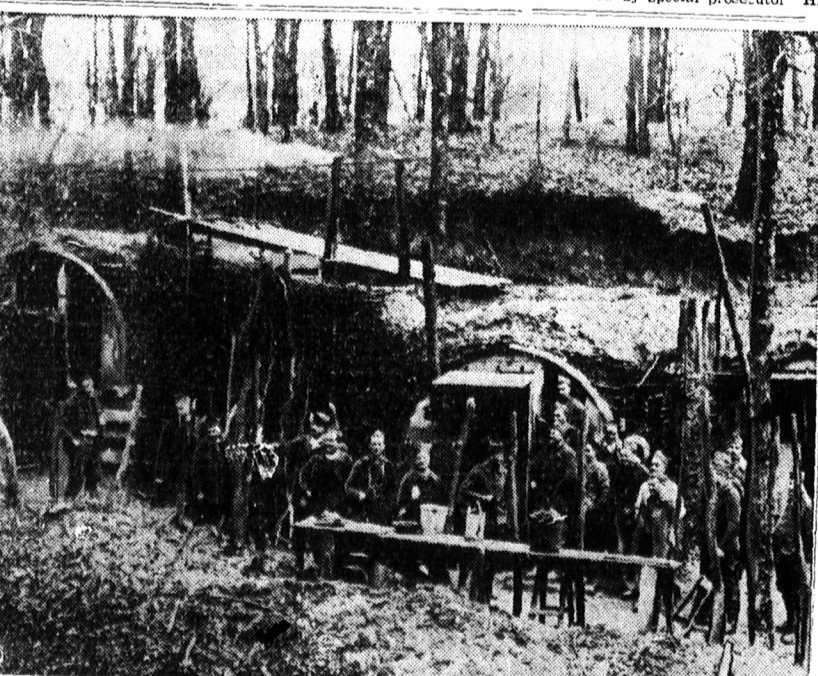

Those named on the combines charge, R. B. Staples, Kelowna, B. C. president of Sales Service Limited, A. C. Lander, Kelowna, secretary of Sales Service Limited. W. P. Ripley, Winnipeg, president of Western Grocers Limited, Alexander McCallum, Winnipeg, president of Dominion Fruit Company Limited. Keremeos Fruits Limited, Keremeos, B. C. Brown Company Limited, Pentiction, B. C. Brown Lander Company Limited, Vernon, B. C. Cascade Fruit Company, Limited, Kelowna, Western Grocers Limited, Winnipeg, Dominion Fruit Company Limited, Winnipeg.

On the conspiracy charge E. J. Chambers, president of Associated Growers of British Columbia Limited is added to the individuals and his company to the corporations.

The combine indictment charges the individuals and companies were parties to a combine between Jan. 1, 1936 and Dec. 31, 1938, in the marketing of the British Columbia fruit and vegetable crop.

The combine, according to the indictment, was arranged by Western Grocers Limited, by obtaining control, in whole or in part, of Lander Company Limited, Sales Service Limited, Keremeos Fruits Limited, Brown Company Limited, Brown Lander Company Limited and Cascade Fruit Company Limited.

Conviction of this charge could carry a maximum penalty of \$10,000 fine or two years imprisonment for individuals and a maximum \$25,000 fine for corporations.

Ottawa, Dec. 21 - (CP) - The Russian Army is a menace "only to the Kremlin Government," Victor Podolski, Polish Consul General to Canada, told the Canadian club here today.

There was a tendency in the present international situation to underestimate the strength of the German forces and to overestimate the Russians, the Polish diplomat declared. Soviet Russia is on the point of disintegration.

"There are only 3,000,000 members of the Communist Party which governs Russia, but Russia has a population of 180,000,000, which means that one Communist rules every 60 other Russians," said Mr. Podolski. He believed the "Communist Tyranny" would soon end.

"Russia is incapable of governing herself," he said. "Several centuries ago a delegation of Russians invited the Scandinavians to become their masters. Even in czarist times, Russia was ruled by foreigners. The Romanoffs were not pure Russian stock, and Catherine the Great was 100 per cent German. Even Stalin, the present Premier, is not a Russian but a Caucasian."

In a military way, Russia had little to show except sheer manpower, Mr. Podolski said. Russian troops moving into Poland and Finland were ill clad, poorly equipped and completely ignorant.

Prosecutions For Evading The Law

VICTORIA, Dec. 21 - (CP) - The attorney-general's department announced today that prosecutions will be launched against five individuals and nine corporations as a result of the report of combines found by the commissioner F. A. McGregor, finding a combine existed in some phases of the marketing of British Columbia fruit.

The first of two indictments, drafted by special prosecutor H. I.

Reorganization Of League Of Nations Forecast

(By Andre Berding, Associated Press Staff Writer) WASHINGTON, Dec. 22 - A sweeping reorganization of the League of Nations is under way and it may bring the United States into closer collaboration with Geneva.

The reorganization would remove from the council, a political body, the technical or non-political work of the League such as its economic studies, refugee work and campaigns against the opium and white slave traffic. The United States is now co-operating to go much further.

The change in League structure has just been recommended by a special committee of six members headed by Stanley Bruce, former premier of Australia. According to information reaching Washington, the recommendation is almost certain of adoption.

Mr. Bruce's committee, appointed especially to see what could be done to augment the non-political work of the League, has submitted a "draft constitution" calling for the setting up of a central committee which would direct and supervise the work on economic and social questions.

The committee came into being as an indirect result of a United States note to the Secretary-General of the League last February in which the State Department praised the League's non-political efforts, promised its thorough cooperation and urged expansion of the work.

Some observers believe that the League, in its non-political work, is just aborning and will grow to a stature far exceeding that of the present League. And toward this

end the United States is already committed to cooperate.
