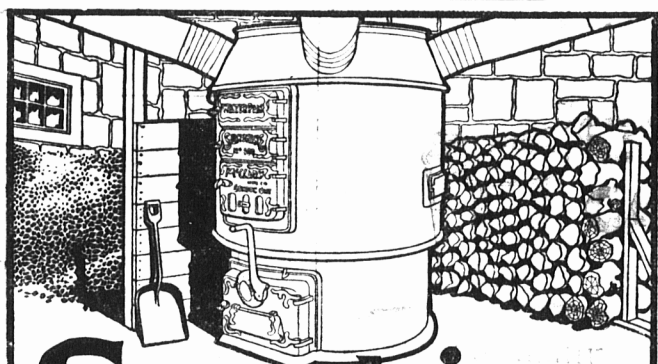

In a moment they had me cornered and started in for their fun!

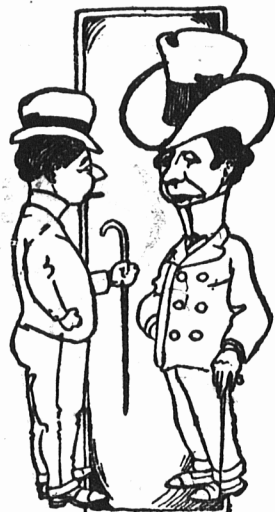
And then, like a great inspiration, there came to my mind the bold claim

BUYING A MOUNTAIN.

Troubles of Owning an Estate Away Up in the Air.

On Wednesday, July 16, 1889, Snowden, the highest mountain peak in Wales, and of all South Britain, rising to a height of 3,660 feet above the level of the sea's surface, was sold by auction in London. It was purchased by Sir William Watkin—created a baronet in 1880—formerly chairman of the South-Eastern Railway Company, and called "the Railway King," representative in the House of Commons at various times of Yarmouth, Stockport, and Hythe, and who died on April 18, 1901, at 80 years of age, and was succeeded in his title by his son, the present Sir Alfred Mellor Watkin. Sir Edward possessed as one of his residences a house in Bedford, by the southern foot of the mountain, whence is one of the ways of ascending; this dwelling being called "The Chalet," which is a French word signifying "cottage." At the auction the first bid was one of £2,000; but the mountain was finally knocked down for \$5,760. Having come into possession of such an owner, a rack-rent railway was laid down by about 1897, the name being applied to one on which there are cog wheels on the wheels which are caught by bars crossing the lines at right angles, the train being thereby prevented from slipping back downwards, as otherwise it naturally would by the law of gravity. Such a railway is of extra expense in construction, this one costing £11,550 a mile, but has been far exceeded in this respect on such heights as the Alps. The Snowden line is four and three-quarter miles in length, and starts from Llanberis, at the north-west foot of the mountain, and terminates at a hotel that crowns the top.
