Editor Charlottetown Guardian,
Dear Sir:—

I wish to thank you personally for the courtesy you extended to the Summer School of Science during its last session. I had the pleasure of making an official and public expression of acknowledgement of our obligation to your citizens and all who contribute toward a very successful meeting, but it seemed to me that your action deserves special personal statements of appreciation. We all talked it over, and were unanimously of opinion that we never had as good reporting nor so much space given us in any paper before except that given by the Halifax Herald at Lunenburg.

We all know the power of the press in helping along any worthy public effort. In my opinion, the one great reason why the School has not shown more rapid growth is the failure of the directors to get the Press as a whole to do just what you did this past summer. Nova Scotia has always held a leading place in the School. I think this may be accounted for largely because the Yarmouth Herald and the Halifax Herald have done so much to help matters along. With your large circulation in P. E. Island, and with the broad reports and well-considered editorials, I shall be much surprised and disappointed if the Island does not send a larger proportion of its teachers and others to the School hereafter. I am sure I express the sentiments of every officer of the School when I attempt to have you understand how cordially we thank you for your efforts to interest the public in an institution which must have a strong influence on the schools of the provinces in the near future.

Liverpool is warmly interested in the next year's session. The Advance has had one editorial and several letters about it already. I mean to demonstrate to all concerned that an actively interested and working Press are necessary for the advance of any public good. We have no money to buy assistance, as our pay at any session does not pay our board. But, like yourself we can do something for the public good without pay, and we feel grateful indeed to know that we have such strong assistance as you have given us in attaining the end we seek.

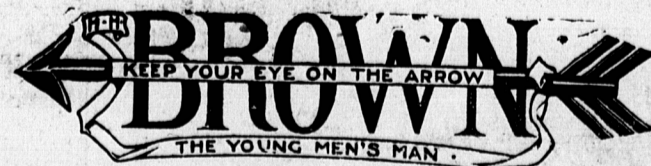
