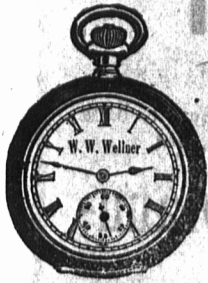

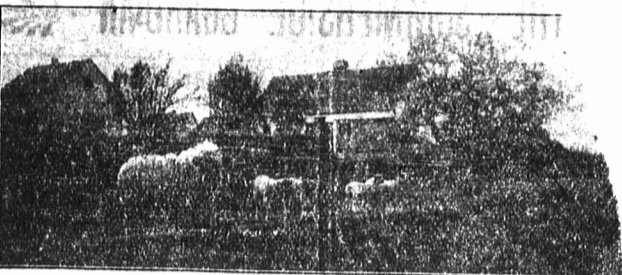

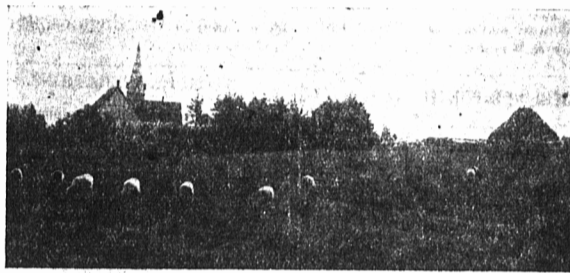
Pastoral Scene



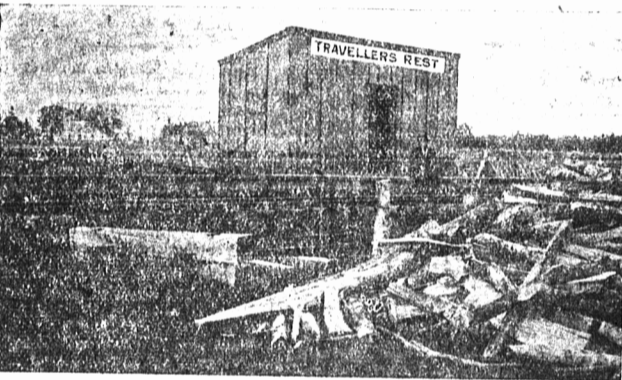
Panorama View of Alberton.



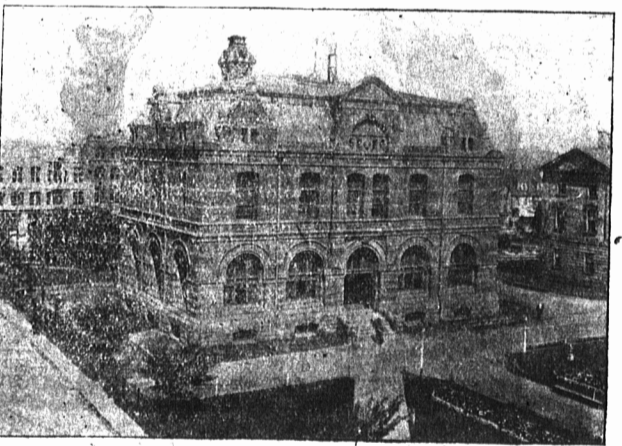
Pastoral Scene at Suffolk.

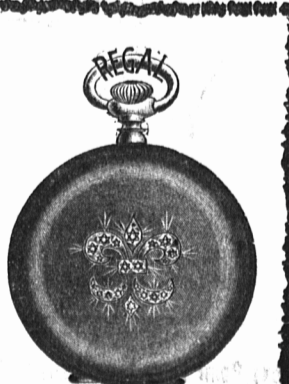
