Supreme Court Rules Re U. S. Forces

OTTAWA, Aug. 3 (CP)—The Supreme Court of Canada today found that the Dominion Government has power to enact legislation granting members of United States forces in Canada immunity from proceedings in Canadian criminal courts, but differed on whether such immunity already exists under International Law.

President Reviews Legion Activities

President N. W. Lowther in his address at the Legion's annual convention of the Provincial Command, Canadian Legion, expressed satisfaction that as a result of a resolution adopted at the last Provincial convention, the Department of Pensions has opened a sub-office in Charlottetown for service men from this Province and has appointed a full time medical representative in the person of Dr. G. R. Summerside.

The President referred to the action taken by the Dominion Command regarding medical treatment of ex-service men. The Legion felt that the men undergoing medical treatment should be given some allowance to provide for their subsistence during the period of hospitalization.

Other Activities The annual Poppy sale President Lowther reported, was carried on very successfully by the different branches of the Legion. During the Christmas season the Provincial Command contacted the Provincial Councils and urged most co-operative in supplying funds to send at least 50 cigarettes to each Islander who was serving in an Island unit overseas.

Resolutions Adopted at Legion Convention

The following report of the annual convention of the Provincial Command, Canadian Legion, is continued from yesterday's Guardian:

RESOLUTIONS WERE PASSED by the convention expressing loyalty to their Majesties the King and Queen Governor General of Canada and the Lieutenant Governor; greeting to Prince Edward Islanders in the fighting forces of the Empire; to the Dominion Front, Comrade A. G. Waters; congratulating Major General W. W. Foster, D.S.O., former Dominion president, on his promotion to the rank of Major General; and appreciation to the Ladies Auxiliary. It also passed the following resolutions:

- Canada's War Effort Affirming its belief in the resolution adopted by the Dominion Convention at Winnipeg and by the last Provincial Convention, calling upon the Federal Government to put into effect all necessary compulsory measures, including conscription of manpower for service overseas, so that Canada may be placed on a total war effort.
Dependents' Allowances Again urging that Dependents' Allowances to widowed mothers be established as a statutory right at the same rate as those payable to the wife of a member of the forces.
Pensions Endorsing the insurance principle regarding pension entitlement in the case of persons suffering from Tuberculosis women serving in our armed forces irrespective of whether or not they may serve in a theatre of actual operations. The work done in this equitable principle to the Pension Act.
Discharge Depot for P.E.I. Requesting the Department of National Defence to make arrangements to the effect that when women from this Province may receive their discharge from the Army at Charlottetown, they be discharged at present retained in the Depot at Halifax pending completion of their documentation.

absence from home on active service in England, their wives prove unfaithful and arrangements must be made by them to have their families cared for. In all the other Provinces of Canada there is a Provincial Court with jurisdiction over matrimonial affairs but in this Province the Court, composed of the Lieutenant-Governor and the Executive Council has not functioned for over seventy-five years.

Resolved that the Provincial Convention of the Canadian Legion E.S.L. be requested and kindred organizations and have subscribed to all loans in aid of the War Effort. Resolved that this convention approve of the construction of Dry Dock in Charlottetown to be used in the interests of the war as a Rehabilitation project. Returned Soldier's Insurance Resolved by this Provincial Convention of the Canadian Legion E.S.L. that the benefits of the returned soldier's Insurance Act be made available to ex-service men desiring to take advantage of its provisions and that special consideration be given to policy holders who have permitted their policies to lapse owing to circumstances but who are now in a position to pay all premiums.

Fuel and Foodstuffs Resolved that while we regret the evident impossibility of providing a new car ferry for next winter we would urge upon the authorities the necessity of giving immediate priority to the purchase of an ice-breaking steamer to keep up communication in case of an accident happening to the present car ferry.
