THE CABLE RESTORED.

Yesterday afternoon the pleasing information was given out that the Anglo-American Telegraph cable at the Capes, which had been interrupted was restored ready for work again. The interruption had lasted for almost two weeks during which period the business and news interests of the Island had suffered great inconvenience and loss. There had been, moreover, great concern lest the damaged cable might not be restored before the formation of heavy ice rendered further efforts to repair it impracticable. In such case we might have been deprived of telegraphic connection with the Mainland for three or four months to come.

The Superintendent and staff of the Telegraph Company appear to have done what they could to effect repairs and in the meantime to have telegraph messages conveyed across the Strait by the regular steamers. We still think that a tug service at the Capes should have been kept up during the two weeks past, thus preventing in considerable measure the long delays in transmission of despatches, and we hold the federal Government responsible for not taking measures to have this urgent want supplied. In case of a like interruption of the wires in the future the neglect of an auxiliary steam service cannot be treated so leniently as it has been on this occasion. Our readers will rejoice with us in the restoration of telegraph connection, and in being able to read in their favorite paper from day to day a telegraphic summary of the news of the outside world.

While Canadian exports of butter during the current season exceed by \$2,000,000 those of last year, it is regrettable to record a falling off of something like \$4,000,000 in cheese. The decreased shipments of cheese were accompanied by an average decline in price amounting to about \$1 per box as compared with the season of 1900.

Carnegie's great gift to Scotland for the promotion of university education has now been followed by a donation of \$10,000,000 to the United States Government to form a trust fund for the advancement of scientific study. He first proposed to donate this sum in bonds of the great Steel Combination in which the bulk of his fortune is invested but finding that President Roosevelt was not disposed to undertake the trust in this form has since decided to pay over the money in cash. It is a very handsome gift and is made to the Government of the country in which his vast fortune was accumulated. It is therefore quite free from the sentimental objections which have been set up against his donation to libraries and for educational purposes in other countries.
