SON LED HOUSE WHILE FATHER LOOKED ON UNIQUE SITUATION

In the Politics of Great Britain—Austen Chamberlain Defends the Attitude of Balfour and his Distinguished Parent Towards the Fiscal Question—The Commons Must Decide if there is to be a Change.

LONDON, Feb. 6.—"My right honorable friend, the member from West Birmingham," as Austen Chamberlain described his father, was the central figure in the drama that marked the opening of parliament.

For the first time in years Joseph Chamberlain took his seat as a private member of the House of Commons, and was separated from his former colleagues in the cabinet by the "gangway." From this seat he saw his son act as leader of the House of Commons, a position which Joseph Chamberlain, with all his years of parliamentary experience, never attained.

Premier Balfour was unable to be present because of influenza. When Austen Chamberlain rose to reply in behalf of the party, of which his own father is supposed to be the most powerful member, the house was spellbound. It had been expected that Sir Ackerley Douglas would take the Premier's place, and interest was also heightened by the fact that Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman, the Liberal leader, had just concluded a merciless satire on Joseph Chamberlain. The situation was without parallel in the recollection of the oldest politician, and all eyes were fixed alternately upon the father and the son.

FATHER NERVOUS FOR SON. Joseph Chamberlain, who had sat un-

moved under the ridicule of the Liberal leader, turned nervously toward his son who now takes precedence over him. With his monocle in his eye, an orchid in his buttonhole, and his hands clasped across his knees, the most prominent figure in the British Empire listened while his son deflected him.

Austen Chamberlain spoke haltingly and under evident strain; yet when he referred to his father, it was always as "the member from West Birmingham."

Now and again jeers greeted Austen Chamberlain, whereupon, with unmistakable anger, his father turned his glance in the direction of the offender, and occasionally Joseph Chamberlain cheered his son on. When Austen Chamberlain reached the conclusion of his defence of the attitude of Premier Balfour and his father towards the fiscal question, the interruptions grew more frequent, and the Chancellor of the Exchequer clutched the brass-bound treasury box, on which Gladstone was so fond of leaning, and addressed his remarks almost solely in the direction of his father. Defiantly Austen Chamberlain accused Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman of attacking the Premier in his absence, and with a touch of pride he said: "The member from West Birmingham is here, he can speak for and look after himself."

MARRIAGE VS SINGLE LIFE.

The Alberry Plains Literary and Debating Society held its usual weekly meeting on Friday, Jan. 29. An ever increasing number of ladies inspired the orators to put forth their best efforts. The subject of debate was the momentous and interesting one "Whether married or single life affords the more pleasure to the individual."

Shortly after seven the meeting was called to order, the efficient president, Chas. McMillan in the chair. In a brief and witty speech, he introduced the opener of the debate, Victor McMillan, who in a thoughtful and convincing manner upheld the married state as being productive of the greater happiness. He reminded his hearers that the greatest of men have often testified that they owe most of their success and inspiration to their wives, mentioning as shining examples, Gladstone and Disraeli. Mr. McMillan on resuming his seat, was heartily applauded by his appreciative audience.

As Mr. Jenkins warmed to his subject, those of us who had cherished secret hopes that we might sometime be promoted to the happy state of matrimony, began to feel our hearts as lead within us, and long faces and doleful looks succeeded the bright smiles of a short time before. In vivid and forceful language, the speaker set forth the trials and miseries of married life. From the awful contemplation of a row of boots completely surrounding the large kitchen stove, the married man is aroused by the voice of his partner, who lays before him the pressing necessity of herself and grown up daughters for fur coats. It matters little that the milk cheques have been small, or that the hens have been striking their duty in an unaccountable manner. Madam declares that they must keep up appearances, and hints, that, if economy is necessary he can wear his suit another year, adding, that nobody notices him anyhow.

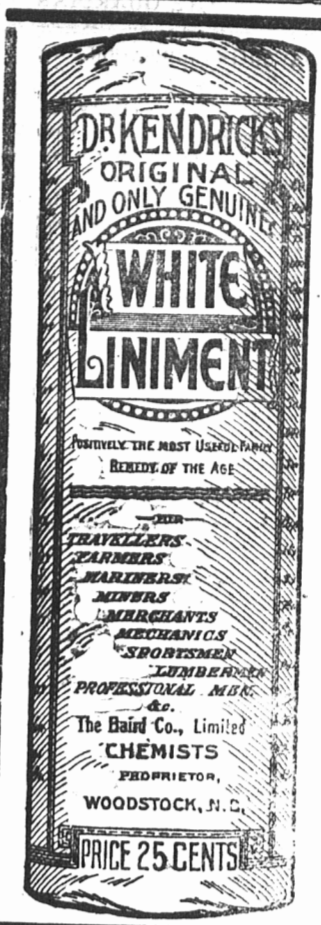
