GERMANY AGAIN TALKING PEACE

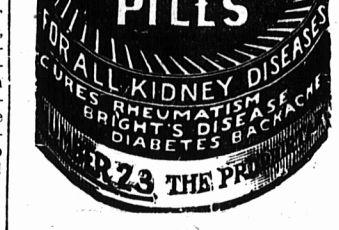
BERLIN, Nov. 30.—(via wireless to Sayville).—In an address to the Reichstag yesterday, in introducing the new peace bill Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg again announced that Germany was ready to end the war by a peace guarantee the existence and future of the nation.

Artillery activity and raids designed to learn each other's disposition of troops were carried on by both sides to-day in the sections of Armentieres, Neuve Chapelle, Ypres and Givenchy. Somewhere in this region north of Arras probably will fall the next blow.
