matriculate and to practise. In Canada, he said, there were no less than eleven such institutions, all of which were doing good work. He believed that the time was not far distant when medical students would require to have a B. A. degree before matriculating.

Dr. Roddick, of Montreal, being absent, the discussion on Dominion Medical Registration was passed over with a few remarks by the President, Drs. Muir and McMillan, the latter to move a resolution later.

Dr. Chisholm, of Halifax, then read his paper on "Asthma and its treatment." It was discussed by Drs. McLeod, Charlottetown, Muir, Truro, Taylor, Charlottetown, Cameron, Antigonish, W. F. Hamilton, Montreal; and Dr. Chisholm, of Halifax, closed the discussion. The meeting then adjourned till 2 p. m.

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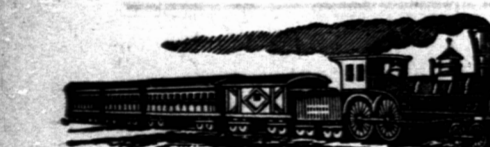
