# A COMING LIGHT

Especially for Country Homes

CHEAPER THAN OIL

Mr. S. E. Reid, of Tryon, gives His Experience with Acetylene Gas Apparatus and Light Generally Used in Ontario.

The announcement was made in these columns some time ago that Mr. S. E. Reid, of Tryon, had introduced the Acetylene gas light into his handsome residence.

This light has come to use within the past two years and we believe Mr. Reid is the first in the maritime provinces to use it.

After a test of about three months THE GUARDIAN applied to him for some information concerning the light, thinking it would be of much interest to many readers:—

In reply Mr. Reid says:—

Replying to your inquiry re our Acetylene Gas Apparatus and light, I may say, the machine was manufactured by the Niagara Falls Acetylene Gas Machine Company. It is constructed in accordance with the Cartier-Bell Patents and licensed under patent issued to Thos. L. Wilson, inventor of the process and manufacturer of Calcium Carbide. This machine is very simple and perfectly automatic in its operation requiring no knowledge of machinery whatever in its care. It is the most practical machine for the generation and utilization of Acetylene gas that has been constructed. It is expressly designed for use in private houses, stores, churches and factories, where a clear and steady light is required, or in fact any place where gas and electricity are now used. Every machine made by this Company is guaranteed to do its work perfectly and to be perfectly automatic, reliable and durable. In private houses it is usually placed in the cellar and there connected with the gas pipes leading to each room requiring to be lighted. The gas fixtures, chandeliers and brackets are the same as those used for ordinary coal or water gas, excepting that the special Acetylene gas burner is required.

After the apparatus is set up, charged with carbide and started it requires little or no attention. It is only necessary once each week to clean out the sediment which forms in the generators and to see that there is sufficient carbide in the generators. The generators hold sufficient carbide to last from two to four months. The gas is produced by the action of water upon carbide. The machine mechanically regulates the quantity of water from time to time brought into contact with the carbide as the consumption requires, so that gas cannot be generated beyond the capacity of the machine.

The source of Acetylene gas is calcium carbide. This is a hard porous grayish black material composed of powdered coke and lime dust, heated in an electric furnace. It is impossible to ignite it or to generate gas from it except by contact with water. The gas is clear and colorless requiring no purification. It is concentrated essence of coal and water gas, both of which owe their illuminating properties to it. It produces a magnificent light. Being exactly the color of natural sunlight, the shade and tint of any object exposed to it is perfectly retained, thus enabling the most delicate colors to be matched or the most intricate work to be performed at night, a property possessed by no other illuminant.

The cost of this light is less than kero-sene oil and less than one half as much as ordinary gas, while the light is superior in every way to either the common gas burner, the Welch burner or the incandescent electric light, with the advantages in favor of Acetylene gas the inconvenient and dangerous coal oil lamp will soon be discarded even in farm houses. At present in Ontario at least 500 farm houses are lighted by acetylene gas, while numbers of people in towns and cities are using this light for stores, factories, churches and private dwellings. It is also used on the Grand Trunk Railway for lighting cars and for locomotive headlights.

Any further information you may ask for regarding the apparatus or light will be cheerfully given.
