## WOMEN'S COUNCIL

International Body Meets in June

### A GREAT ASSEMBLY

Programme of Its Work—  
Subjects to be Dealt With—  
What It Has Done.

An American woman, in all probability, will be chosen President of the international body of woman to meet in London in June representing the United States, Canada, Germany, Sweden, Great Britain and Ireland, New Zealand, New South Wales, Italy, France, Holland, Denmark, Belgium, Finland, and Switzerland. Mrs. May Wright Sewall of Indianapolis, President of the National Council of women of the United States, is considered the most promising candidate for the Presidency of the International Council of Women, which will open its second Quinquennial session in the latter part of June in London.

A number of Chicago women will attend the meeting of the international council. Efforts are being made to have Miss Jane Adams deliver an address before the convention. Dr. Sarah Hackett Stevenson will speak, and Mrs. Frank Johnson, chairman of the dress committee of the National Council of Women, will attend the convention.

A large number of women from the United States will form a party to attend the sessions of the body.

Lady Aberdeen has issued with the call for the session an amended program. A public meeting for the discussion of international Arbitration will be arranged by the Countess of Aberdeen to be held in Queen's Hall on June 27, and the political section will arrange for a meeting in the interests of suffrage to be held on June 29.

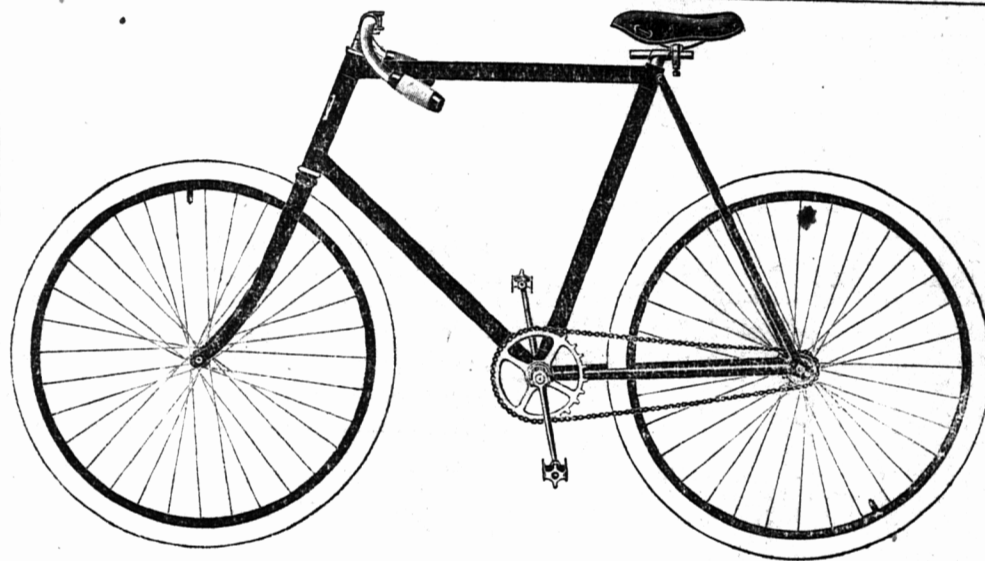
**SUBJECTS FOR DISCUSSION.**  
The subjects for discussion in the different sectional meetings cover every phase of activity to which woman is related. The scheme of subjects for papers which has been arranged for the legislative and industrial section includes topics treating "The Ethics of Wage Earning," "The Unpaid Services of the Housewife," "Equal Pay for Equal Work," "The Living Wage," "The Pocket Money Wage," and "Legal Regulation Wages."

The subject of labor legislation for women is to be treated in relation to child bearing women, to hours of woman's labor, and to unsanitary conditions. "Trade Unionism," "Cooperating and Profit Sharing," "Technical and Industrial Training for Women," "Provident Schemes," "Scientific Treatment of Domestic Service," "The Home as a Workshop," and "The Civil Disabilities of Women, as to Marriage Laws, as to Divorce Laws, as to the Custody and Guardianship of Children, and as to Married Women's Property Laws," are other subjects which will come before the legislative section for consideration.

The professional section will consider the needs and accomplishments of women in every branch of service, from medicine to agriculture. Farming as an occupation for women will be considered in its various phases, including dairying, poultry raising, stock breeding, bee-keeping, silk culture, and veterinary surgery. Experts will explain the beauties of gardening as an employment for women and the methods of training women for the occupation. The effect of the admission of women to the professions upon domestic life will be

discussed and "The Spirit of Purity in Art and Its Influence on the Well-Being of Nations" is a prominent topic. Other subjects for the section are: "The Drama as a Field for Women," "Women in Literature," "Women in Journalism," "Openings for Training of Clerical Workers," and "Women's work as Doctors in Private Practice and Under

Government."  
Papers in Political Section.  
The scheme for political section comprises discussions of parliamentary enfranchisement of women, the responsibilities and duties of women in politics, women's status in local government and in administrative work.  
The social section will consider the following topics:  
The Treatment of Women in Prisons.  
The Treatment of Children in Reformatories.  
Treatment of the Destitute Class.  
Protection of Young Travellers.  
The Social Necessity of an Equal Moral Standard for Men and Women.  
The Public Control of Amusements.  
The Public Control of the Liquor Traffic.  
Pension Schemes for Old Age.  
The program for the educational section includes the discussion on the following topics:  
The Child, Life and Training.  
The Teaching of Mentally and Physically Defective Children.

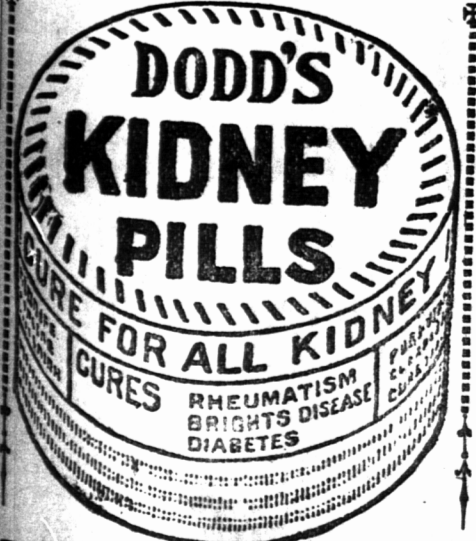
