Academic Course Necessary For Nurses

TORONTO, June 2.—(By the Canadian Press)—Two thousand nurses will be graduated from Ontario hospitals in the next two years—what is going to happen to them? This was the question put by Miss S. A. Edge to the Registered Nurses of District Number 6 when they met to hear a discussion on the G. M. Weir report on nursing education in Canada.

Some hospitals take the attitude that once the nurse has graduated she ceases altogether to be their responsibility, said Miss Edge; this was, of course, rather difficult for the pupil who had spent three years doing arduous hospital training. She suggested that older nurses who had been having plenty of work should visit relatives or take holidays this summer in order to give a chance to newer graduates, without homes or any other means of support.

"The cities are deluged with nurses for whom there is no work," said Miss Edge. "This is chiefly because the small hospitals turn out nurses who want to come, naturally enough, to the city." Whithy had out its training class from 45 to 15, and was taking graduates on floor duty. This was a move in the right direction.

Miss I. M. Macintosh of Hamilton, said the growth of nurses in Ontario was making "perilous progress." She held that the economic status of the private duty nurse—serious as it was at the present time—was not the most serious problem. More serious than that was the question of weakening morale. "At the present time," she said, "there is no correlation between the need of nursing services, and the supply of graduate nurses."

Miss Macintosh was strongly in agreement with the proposed raising of the academic requirements for the nurse. "A foundation of junior matriculation for the woman who wishes to enter a training school for nurses," she said, "can not but help to raise the standard of nurses. Better preparations all along the line will give more efficient service from which still stronger public support and confidence will be gained."

Veteran Bonus Expeditionary Force
WASHINGTON, June 2 (A.P.)—With hundreds of recruits en route to the United States capital, Superintendent of Police Glasford today asked the Senate district committee to approve a \$75,000 appropriation to feed the jobless war veterans who are demanding cash payment of the bonus.

Reports have reached Glasford that 600 former soldiers are nearing the city to join the estimated 1,500 now here. Approximately 600 have been billeted in two vacant buildings.
Glasford said he did not know "what may develop from the present situation."
Meanwhile, leaders of the "bonus expeditionary force" continued their lobbying activities in the House of Representatives, seeking to obtain 145 signatures to the Patman resolution to call up the bonus bill for a House vote. It now has 102, a gain of four for the day.

Lonely Alchemist Inhabits Village Though For Sale

TONNERRE, Burgundy, June 2—On the main Paris-Dijon highway, where a little country road crosses it, there is a sign post with the notice: "Country village for sale." All around, high hills covered with vines stretch as far as the eye can see, broken here and there with a touch of forest, spires of ancient churches, reddish brown towers of saucy castles.

The heart of Burgundy. A little way down the country lane a dark circle of pines hides a group of weather-beaten houses with deep windows, thick stone walls and little square Burgundian towers. Each is flanked by a long red-roofed stone barn. The twilight air is heavy with the odor of Hawthorn. A fountain plays silently at one end of the little square. An enormous oak, vigorous in age, throws its shadows across the water of a stagnant pool. To its tough bark is nailed a board:

"Village for sale. Owing to depopulation. To be auctioned off. Twenty-five houses, farms, for 500,000 francs (\$20,000)."

A slight sound breaks the austere silence. A sign, worn and defaced with age, points the way to a drug store. At the back of the shop, a light flickers on greenish flasks. Bent over the crucible is a man, tall, thin, emaciated. His shadow wavers on phial and flask in the ghostly atmosphere.

"Is it possible, Monsieur, that you remain in the deserted village?" The mystic alchemist, graduate of the School of Pharmacy at Lyons, dilly answers that he has every intention of staying. Theories on rural depopulation, on the fate of this 2000 year old village leave him unmoved.

Yet he has an odd taste for the exotic. Pots of dwarf Barbary fig

trees, cacti, and other bearded and sworded species challenge the eye. In the windows, between ancient Venetian porcelain jars bearing names of strange herbs in old Latin letters, stands one, more dangerous than the rest, a robust plant bursting with a kind of boisterous vulgarity out of its modest pot.

"But no," comes the unexpected reply, "Asiatic. And when it reaches full development, it will be 40 feet in diameter and 80 feet high. Then the world will come in crowds. Yes, yes, in crowds."

The phial in the hands glowed strangely. The village deserted by man is inhabited by dreams!
