THE RECIPROcity AGREEMENT.

The total value of American goods imported to Canada from the United States last year, that is for the year ended with March last, and which are affected by the reciprocity agreement was \$47,827,959.

It will be seen that the agreement touches 95 millions in value of the imports and exports of the two countries.

A WORD WITH "THE PIONEER."

TYPHOID IN OTTAWA.

The entire Dominion has an interest in the sanitary condition of Ottawa where an epidemic of typhoid fever has caused many deaths and has filled all the hospitals to overflowing, because the representatives of the entire country are required to spend about half the year in that city.

He finds that the water supply is contaminated with sewage; that the bay from which the water is drawn is so situated with regard to the city that the water is unfit for consumption, and this condition, he says, is one which would hardly be tolerated in any hamlet of the Province of Ontario, much less in the capital city of the Dominion.

WHAT THE CONSTITUTION SAYS.

Referring to the long-standing vacancies on the Supreme Court Bench and in the Senate representation of this Province The Patriot says:

"These appointments lie with the Federal Government and when it is good and ready no doubt the appointments will be made."

The British North America Act, which is the Constitution of Canada, has something to say in regard to this matter. Section 32 reads as follows:

"32. When a Vacancy happens in the Senate, by Resignation, Death or otherwise, the Governor General shall, by Summons to a fit and qualified Person, fill the Vacancy."

The words of the Constitution are explicit and they are not permissive but mandatory. It is not said that the Governor General "may," but that he "shall" fill the vacancy. As to the time when he shall do this the words of the Constitutional Act are, "When a vacancy happens."

Now, well on in the second session of Parliament after the vacancy happened the Government organ in Charlottetown tells the people that when the Government "gets good and ready no doubt the appointments will be made." How far this is in compliance with the Constitution and respectful to the people of this Province, we leave our readers to judge.

What Liberal candidate would dare to face the electors of Queen's County at the present time and tell them, as The Patriot does, that the Government will appoint a Judge and a Senator "when it gets good and ready?"

The New York Herald counts confidently on the reciprocity agreement meeting with approval, not only in Canada and the United States, but in Great Britain as well. It says: "Sane legislators in the United States, in Great Britain and in Canada are in the ascendant, and backed by popular sentiment the trade agreement between the American people and their northern friends and neighbors will soon be an accomplished fact."

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency of the Agency of the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certificate and affidavit by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to secure homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre—Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 10 b. in '94 and erect a house worth \$200.00. Deputy of the Minister of the Interior N.
