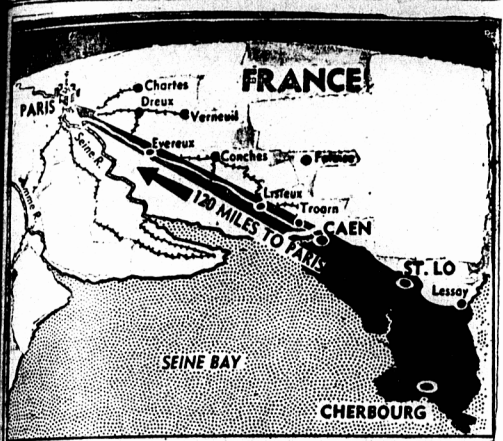

Flew Direct From Britain To No. Africa

NAPLES, July 24 (CP)—King George of Britain, trim in the uniform of a Field Marshal, landed last night in Italy on an inspection tour which will carry him to forward battle fronts approaching Florence and Rimini.

The King, on his first visit to Italy since the outbreak of war, appeared fresh after the swift trip broken by one nine-hour halt. Gen. Sir Henry Maitland Wilson, Mediterranean theatre commander, first greeted him. The Admiral Sir John Cunningham, Allied Navy commander in this theatre, and Harold McMillan, British Minister to the French Committee in Algiers, and Air Vice-Marshal G. B. A. Baker greeted their monarch.

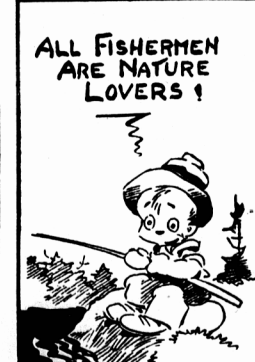
