N.S. Egg Laying Contest

At the close of the fourth period of the Nova Scotia contest conducted by the Experimental Farm, Napton, three pens of New Brunswick Barred Rocks take the first three places.

Mr. E. W. Smith's pen from Prince William is leading, with 628 eggs and 563.9 points, while Mr. F. Toft's pen from Moore's Mills is second with 553 eggs and 518.6 points. The third place goes to Mr. W. A. Season's pen from Durham Bridge, with 460 eggs and 448.8 points.

The leading individual in Barred Rock No. 103 in Mr. Toft's pen, with 83 eggs and 83.9 points. Mr. K. W. Smith has the second and third birds with 83 eggs and 84.6 points and 78 eggs and 79.2 points, respectively.

The grand total production to date is 8,218 eggs and 7,460.1 points.
