INTO PULP OF THE TOOTH

Cocaine is Injected By the
Latest Invention in
Modern Dentistry.

HURTS NO MORE THAN A
H-I-R CUT.

(Extract from "The Cleveland Leader"
June 25, 1904.)

Painlessness in dental operations is
thing that interests the practitioners of
dentistry no less than the long suffering
public.
Every dentist hates to hurt a patient,
and many things have been tried in an
effort to avoid pain. In the last few years
particularly great strides have been
made, and it seemed to the dentists at
forming the annual meeting of the
Northern Ohio Dental Association, recent-
ly held in this city, and the goal was at
most in sight.
The things demonstrated in one clinic
at that meeting seemed to go to the
truth, but the man who demonstrated the
method, original with himself, stated the
other day that he has yet to record a
failure after something like 700 successful
applications.
The method includes the introduction
of minute quantities of cocaine into the
nerve tubes in the dentine of the teeth
under considerable pressure by means of
a specially constructed syringe, called a
dental obturator. First a tiny hole is
drilled just through the enamel down to
softer dentine, preferably just beside the
cavity, if one exists. Then the tapering
steel point of the dental obturator is fit-
ted tightly into the hole and cocaine in 5 per
cent solution is forcibly injected into the
dentine of the tooth. Then, in a minute
and a half or two, in minute the tooth is
obtained, or anesthetized, so that any
part of dental operation causes almost no
pain at all. The doctor said that opera-
tion caused no more discomfort than a
hair cut.
Demonstrations in Indianapolis excited a
great deal of interest, and the method and
the instrument is being experimented with
by dentists in all parts of the country.
One of the points about the use of the
dental obturator insistently dwelt upon is
the simplicity of the instrument and the
readiness with which it can be used. This
was the reason, the doctor stated, why
such good results were reported by those
who had used it.
The growth of the idea, which about six
months ago turned out the perfected in-
strument, is interesting. Immediately af-
ter the introduction of cataphoresis Dr.
Charles G. Myers, of this city, bought one
of the outfits. The early instruments were
imperfect, he says, and at any rate the re-
sults did not seem satisfactory. Later
improvements obtained most of the early
difficulties, but still Dr. Myers thought
that he could devise a simpler apparatus.
Alternating electric currents were tried.
Air pressure and nitrous oxide under
pressure were experimented with and given
up.
For a long time, Dr. Myers stated, he
had wondered if cocaine could not be
applied mechanically. He started out
to try it, and had a powerful direct pres-

JAP LOAN ISSUED
LONDON, Nov. 11.—The prospectus of the
