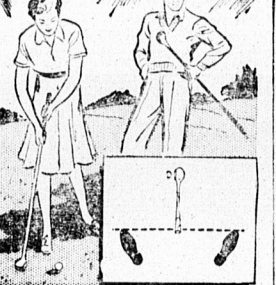

Play Better Golf With These Helpful Pointers



**New Backset Shows Right Form**  
The dub golfer, giving herself away right at the start by her awkward stance. Good golfers don't enjoy a round with her!

To join the golfing crowd you've got to hold up your end. But if you've never had the proper instruction, golf may seem much harder than it is.

Good golf doesn't require lots of muscle and stamina, but simply that you hit the ball the most efficient way. In delivering any kind of blow, balance is vital.

Always start your swing from a balanced position. Distribute your weight evenly on both feet. Bend forward from the waist and very slightly from the knees, so that your legs are almost straight but free from strain or tension.

A line drawn between the two feet and another from the club-head to this first line should form the letter T, as the diagram shows. If your position is correct you should be able to hold it several minutes without tiring.

**THE COOK'S CORNER**  
**THREE-IN-ONE CASSEROLE**  
1 No. 2 can corn  
6 cups potatoes, peeled and sliced  
1 onion sliced thin  
4 tablespoons flour  
2 tablespoons butter  
2 teaspoons salt  
Pepper  
8 thick pork chops  
Method: Place a layer of potatoes in the bottom of a greased baking dish. Sprinkle with flour, salt and pepper and dot with butter. Place several slices of onion on this, then a layer of corn. Add more potatoes and other ingredients as suggested. Pour the liquid from the corn over the top. Brown the chops in melted fat and lay these over the potato-corn mixture. Cover the dish and bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for about 1 1/4 hours.  
If there is not enough liquid in the can of corn, you might add milk or cream in its place.
