Camp Brighton serves to recall that the British and Canadian systems of military service are voluntary. We have no conscription. Men enlist of their own free will. They know that the country has needed defenders in the past and that they may be needed again. The Soldier of the King represents the armed might of the Empire. His uniform and weapons are supplied from the King's storehouses and armories. He must be drilled as well as clothed and armed, that he shall stand erect, bear himself worthily, understand every order and instantly obey it, know the use of his weapons, how to march, how to fight and to die if needs be, alone or among his comrades. He must be brave, enduring, resourceful. His duties may be those of a lone sentinel at an outpost, in the forest, or at the city gate, or as one of ten thousand charging on the battlefield, or fighting behind the defences of one of the King's strongholds. The honor and prestige of his King, of the red cross flag and of his country are entrusted to his keeping. He is always the King's man, the King's soldier. How many inspiring examples for duty in all the lines of life's activity are furnished by the soldier's calling! We can here touch upon but a very few.

Duty was Wellington's watchword a hundred times in his despatches and addresses to his soldiers he used the word duty. We do not recall that he ever spoke of glory. But he found, as Tennyson has so eloquently sung, "that the path of duty is the way to glory." So too we may recall that never-dying signal message of Nelson to his fleet before the battle of Trafalgar: "England expects every man to do his duty." Duty has been the watchword of every true soldier, and has ennobled the profession of arms in all ages. When Pompeii was excavated after being buried for many centuries beneath the ashes, the skeletons of its people were found in very different situations. Some were in the streets, as if attempting to escape. Some were found in deep vaults, as if they had gone there for security. There were some found in lofty chambers. But where did they find the Roman sentinel? They found him standing at the city gate where his captain had placed

him, with his body hand still grasping his weapon. There while the storm of fire threatened above; there while the earth shook beneath him, he had stood at his post, and there after eighteen hundred years he was found. There are other battles than those of the warrior, battles not made with rifles and cannon, or with "confused noise and garments rolled in blood." We are called to fight the flames, that threaten our homes and property; the diseases that endanger the lives of our loved ones. Equally we are called to fight against the evils and wrongs that are in the world the intemperance that desolates our families and swallows up so much of hope and happiness; the corruption that would make representative institutions a delusion, and would strangle the very life of the state. These are lifelong duties; there is no discharge in this war; and the call to this service comes to every man to fight manfully. In the world's broad field of battle, In the bivouac of life Be not like dumb driven cattle— Be a hero in the strife! The great fight is to sustain every good cause, to support every virtuous endeavor, to uplift our fellow men, to repress and eradicate every vice and every wrong. To all thus engaged duty is the watchword and a crown awaits "him that overcometh." He shall be a king among his fellows. It is after all worth while to be able to say at the last, as did one Grand Old Man of days long past, to say without boasting, but in very truth: "I have fought a good fight. I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown."
