PROVISIONS.—Wholesale grocers report an active business notwithstanding the fact that orders for lumbermen must be considerably less than usual. Chicago advices say pork is higher and scarcer, and some of the large packers there claim to have none to offer this week. Quite an advance is reported in compound lard, says the Maritime Merchant, it went up a half a cent a pound on Tuesday morning of this week. The domestic supply of pork is fairly large at the present time owing to the disposition of farmers to kill off their hogs because of the higher prices of grain and potatoes. Halifax packers are paying 11 cents and in Charlottetown 10 1/2 cents for light hogs; in Ontario the price of domestic hogs is quite strong owing to the lack of supplies for export. We asked an authority on the pork trade what his views of the situation were, and he replied that he would not venture predictions, that in times like these, all past experiences counted for so little that the best of men could do was to simply take things as they find them from day to day and not build too much on what would happen tomorrow. Bacon, hams and pure lard are naturally higher in sympathy with the strength of pork.
