—S. S. FLEURIS CALLED AT SUMMERSIDE—The S. S. Fleuris called at Summerside on Wednesday with a miscellaneous cargo and took away a quantity of potatoes. The S. S. Northland is expected at Summerside on Monday which will no doubt close this season's navigation for this port. S

—STREETS COMPLETED—The program of street paving undertaken by the Summerside Town Council this year has just been completed. This work gave employment to a great number of men and the Town Council have intimated that there will be no unemployment relief from the town this winter. Many of the side streets were paved this summer and Water Street West, besides 1000 feet of hard surface road from Duke Street to beyond Northumberland Street. The Warren Paving Co. had the contract for the work and have paid out in the vicinity of \$39,000 in wages this season, which should go a long way toward keeping the labouring man this winter. The Warren Paving Company have also laid approximately 20,000 tons of gravel on the Western Road from the limits of the Town of Summerside to two miles west of Miscouche. The dangerous corner at Miscouche was taken out when repairing the road which is thought by many to be a great improvement. S
