MINUTES OF PRESBYTERY.

The Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met in St. James' Hall, Charlottetown, on Tuesday, the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twelve years, at twelve o'clock noon and was constituted by the Moderator, Mr. A. J. McNeill, with whom were present Messrs. T. F. Fullerton, W. H. Spencer, John Hawley, A. J. W. Back, D. Fraser, R. P. Murray, J. W. McKenzie, D. McLean, A. Craise, ministers, T. C. James, James Harris, and Lieut. Gov. Rogers, elders.

A call from the congregation of Riverfield and Howick, in the Presbytery of Montreal, to Mr. D. Fraser, Cardigan, was considered. The clerk stated that he had cited the Session and Congregation of Cardigan to appear for their interests at this meeting, and his action was sustained. Mr. J. W. McKenzie represented the congregation calling and the Presbytery of Montreal, and spoke of the heartiness and unanimity of the call. Commissioners from Cardigan, namely, Messrs. D. C. Morson, James Gillis, A. G. Crawford, James Harris, Neil McCannell, D. McKenzie, and Arch. McEachern testified to the excellent work done by their minister during his pastorate, and the earnest desire of the people that he should remain among them. Mr. McKenzie having replied, and Mr. Fraser having stated his mind on the matter, the call was, on motion, placed in Mr. Fraser's hands

and accepted by him. It was moved by Mr. T. F. Fullerton, seconded by Mr. W. H. Spencer, and carried, that the translation be granted and the pastoral tie dissolved, to take effect on and after the fifteenth day of September instant.

Mr. M. N. McLeod was appointed interim moderator of Cardigan session, and instructed to have the charge declared vacant as soon as possible after the fifteenth instant. A letter was read from Dr. E. A. McCurdy, Halifax, stating that the Foreign Mission Committee had appointed the Rev. J. A. Scrimgeour, Principal of the Naparima College, San Fernando, to succeed Rev. A. D. McKenzie as missionary in Demerara, and asking if the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island is likely to support Mr. Scrimgeour as it did Mr. McKenzie. On motion this letter was laid on the table to be discussed at a fuller meeting.

Mr. A. Craise reported on his work at the Prince Edward Island Hospital. This report was received and adopted, and ordered to be transmitted to the secretary of the Home Mission.

At the request of Mr. T. F. Fullerton and in deference to him, the clerk was, on motion, instructed to substitute the name of Dr. T. C. Jack, North Sydney, for that of Mr. Fullerton as the Presbytery's nominee for the moderatorship of the forthcoming Synod.

Mr. A. J. McNeill intimated that he moderated in a call at Caledonia on the second day of September instant in favor of Mr. A. E. Millar, Lake Ainslie, Cape Breton, and asked that a meeting of Presbytery be held at Montague on the seventeenth instant to receive and sustain the call.

Presbytery adjourned to meet at Montague on Tuesday, the seventeenth day of September instant, according and within the Presbyterian church there at two o'clock in the afternoon, of which public intimation was given, and this adjournment was closed with the benediction.
