To his sister Sarah, wife of David Small, the sum of \$2000.  
To his sister, Jane Dodd, the sum of \$2000.  
To his nephew, William Dodd Small, the sum of \$2000.  
To his niece, Miss Joan Small, the sum of \$2000.  
To his grandson, Frederick Walker Ing, the interest of \$3000 till he comes of age, when he is to receive the principal.  
To his daughter Lillian Hammond Doid, (Mrs. Mahon) the sum of \$35,000, the interest of which she draws during life; at her death the amount goes to her heirs.  
To his son, Dr. Simon Walker Dodd, the sum of \$15,000.  
To Mr. W. H. Sampson, St. John, N. B., the sum of \$1000, and to each of her three children 1000.  
To Dr. William Fethick, of Bedeque, the sum of \$1000.  
To Henry A. S. Fethick, at present of Arupric, Ont., the sum of \$ 000  
To the rector and wardens of St. Paul's Church, the sum of \$1000.  
To the trustees of the P. E. Island Hospital, the sum of \$2000.  
To his trustees, to be applied by them towards the establishment of a public library in Charlottetown, the sum of \$5000.

In addition to the cash bequests enumerated above, provision is made for the distribution of his real estate and household furniture the beneficiaries being his widow, Dr. Dodd and Mrs. Mahon.  
Mr. F. L. Hazard, Q. C., and Mr. H. J. Cundall, are trustees and executors under the will.
