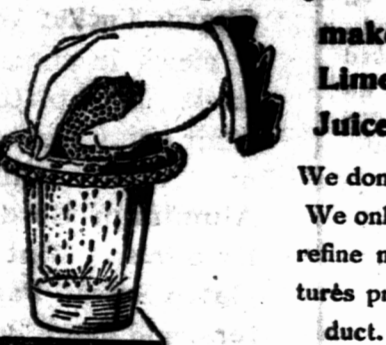
Public Holiday

A WESTERN VIEW.

The Victoria, B. C. Colonist rises to remark that "the Maritime provinces propose to monkey with the British North America Act to prevent their representation in the Dominion Parliament being decreased. If effects of confederation which were not foreseen when confederation took place are good reason for altering terms and obligations, British Columbia will be glad to take a hand in the game. That elegant piece of sheepskin will not be able to recognize itself when this Province gets through. The Maritime provinces had better leave things as they are, and take the bitter with the sweet."

This is a characteristic western view of the case and it is a very crude one. The British North America Act is simply an act of the British Parliament, and in no way partakes of the features of finality and unchangeability reputed to belong to the laws of the Medes and Persians. In fact, if it had not been for the possibility of change in British laws the Empire of which we are all so proud would doubtless long ere this have been disintegrated. But moreover the B. N. A. Act of 1867 has already been subjected to change, amendment and addition. Witness the British North America Act 1871, conferring upon the Parliament of Canada the power to establish new Provinces. Witness also the Parliament of Canada Act, 1873, an Imperial Act which repealed Section 18 of the original British North America Act and established a new section in its stead. Witness furthermore the British North America Act 1886, which gave the new power to the Parliament of Canada to provide representation in the Commons and Senate for the Territories.

Here we have three Acts instead of the original basic Act, which we are advised must be conserved together and may be cited as the British North America Acts 1867 to 1886. It is clearly as practicable to further amend the Constitutional Act as it was in the years just named. It is clearly the duty of the Imperial Parliament to do this when the Constitutional Act has been found to operate unjustly and inequitably. And moreover British Columbia is the one Province which ought to be the very last object to what the Maritime Provinces now claim, inasmuch as the Pacific Province is the one which has for years been over-represented, and because the Eastern Provinces ask only to have their original number of representatives continued to them. That number was based on population existing at the time of the union, whereas British Columbia had not for twenty years after joining the Dominion the population which would fairly entitle it to the representation it enjoyed.

STEAMER RUSTINGTON FLOATED.

MONTREAL, Aug. 4.—Steamer Rustington, Captain Bonnot, which ran ashore at Baranby Island was floated today. The vessel will repair at Quebec.

ACCIDENTLY SHOT HIMSELF.

SIMCOE, August 4.—Bert Imrie, aged 17, accidentally shot himself this morning while handling a revolver. He died instantly. The youth was a nephew of Rev. Mr. Dey, of Simcoe.

THAT APPENDICITIS CASE.

Sir.—In a recent issue of your paper there appears a letter signed "Humanity" calling attention to an operation for appendicitis, that was performed in Gaspaud some weeks ago. Although no names are mentioned in the letter, yet it is plain to anyone that the case cited was that of the late Robert E. Trowsdale. I consider the letter in question quite uncalled for and the nom de plume by which it is signed a complete misnomer. Inhumanity would, I think be a more fitting name for the writer of such a letter at this particular time. It is difficult to say what the writer's motives were in penning such an epistle—whether to cause discord and ill feeling among the doctors of this community or to make the friends of the deceased believe that a mistake had been made I know not; but it is plain to my mind that the writer was not actuated by worthy motives, nor is his letter of inquiry in the interests of humanity. My object in writing this letter is to state emphatically that the family and friends of the deceased had and still have every confidence in the doctors who had charge of the case and that the insinuations of an anonymous writer like Humanity will not in any degree lessen that confidence. Doctors Boyver and Jenkins need no defence from anyone for the course they adopted as they are men of recognized ability and high standing in their profession and we feel satisfied they did what was best under the circumstances.

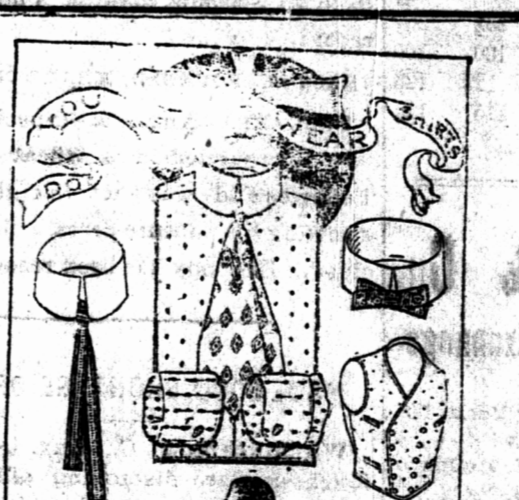
