**Stock Markets At A Glance**  
WINNIPEG, Aug. 30—(CP)—Rye futures prices for December and May reached new seasonal highs while October futures made maximum gains of five cents per bushel in active trading on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today.  
NEW YORK, Aug. 30—(AP)—Selected Stocks, under the leadership of steels rails and specialties enjoyed a last-minute rally in today's market after early selling failed to follow through.  
Transfers of 800,000 shares compared with 900,000 Wednesday and were the smallest since Aug. 22.  
The Associated Press 60-stock average was up .1 of a point at 96.8.  
MONTREAL, Aug. 30—(CP)—Gains and losses were fairly well balanced in moderate activity on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market today. Indices for utilities and industrial groups narrowed while papers and golds eased.  
Hiram Walker jumped four points today. Sicks Breweries advanced a point while the voting trust eased. Canadian Breweries Preferred gained and the common regained a loss. Labatt's also gained while Melchers slipped.  
Trading box score: 114,400 shares; mines 92,600; industrial 20,900; stocks higher 45; lower 45; unchanged 57.

TORONTO, Aug. 30—(CP)—The gold stocks developed a strong note, especially in the cheaper issues and they registered an index gain of 84 on the Toronto exchange today. Action on the golds was chiefly responsible for the volume increase to 1,034,000 shares. Western oils had a small gain and the base metals were narrowly lower. After tomorrow's session the market will improve until Tuesday, Sept. 4, observing Labor Day, Sept. 3.  
Two new stocks came on the board today. They were Curran Mining Company which traded actively, opening at 70 cents and closing at 95 and New Canadian Mines, trading in moderate volume at 35 cents.  
CHICAGO, Aug. 30—(AP)—Heavy futures of rye futures on a report that permits will be issued for export of 1,000,000 bushels of the nation's small visible supply in terminals caused rye prices to leap upward the permissible five-cent-a-bushel limit today.

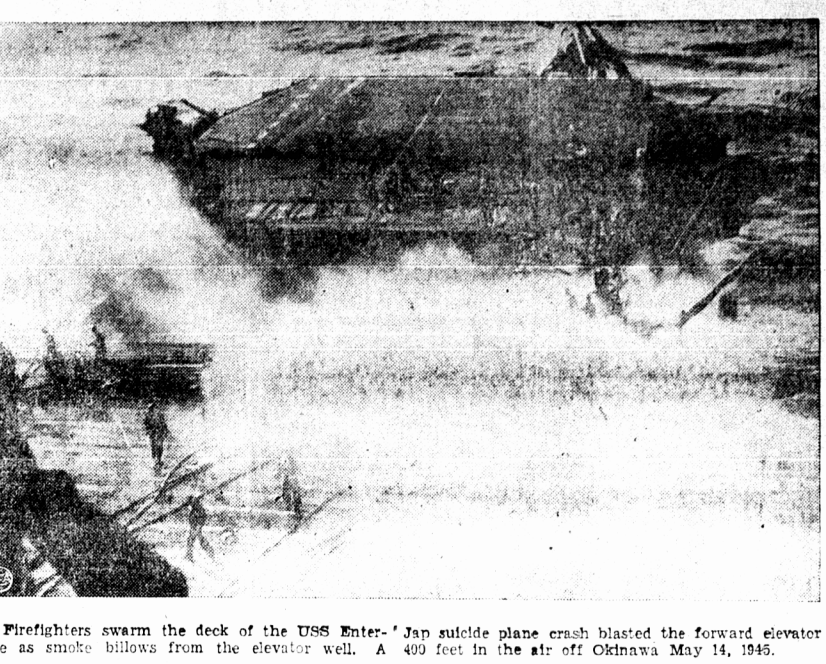

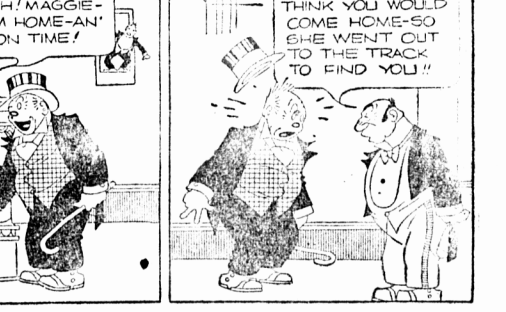

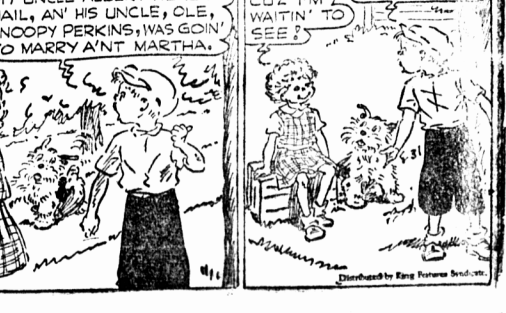
