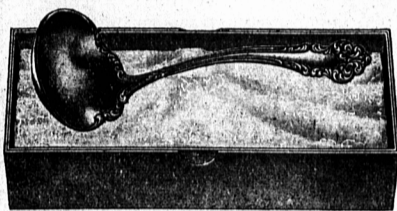

They consisted of the members of the Souris Whist Club, and they managed to spend a very pleasant evening. They came and returned by a special train and had a most enjoyable trip. They put up at the Victoria while in the City.

The ice is in shape for trotting. The half-mile track on the North River is just splendid ice, 1 1/2 inches in thickness. A meeting will be held at Fred Cameron's office tonight. Horses intending to race must be entered at that time. There will be a 2.50 and green race, to start Wednesday next the 9th at 1.30 p. m. A large number of horses will enter and a good afternoon's sport is sure.

Her remains were taken to Malpeque by the noon train on Monday and laid to rest among her friends and relatives.

A provincial correspondent says: "The grass seeds are likely to be dear this spring. There is a good deal of timothy, but little clover seed. The season was too wet. Alsike grows well in the province and some farmers have as much as three tons of it some years. But this year they have scarcely enough for their own sowing. In Ontario there was a dry year, and a dry year there means a good crop of clover. The merchants are quoting clover seed away up though. As a province, all are pretty well cured of cheap seed. The schoolmaster has been abroad in these matters. The seed meetings from the Pure Seed Division, Ottawa, the scholarship at Truro, the general trend of agricultural instruction, have all tended to greater care in the selection of seed.

The second game of the New Brunswick series for the Intercollegiate Hewson trophy was played in the Sackville rink last week. Although the ice was somewhat soft a fast game was played. Mt. Allison started in with a rush and scored twice soon after the start. For quite a while the play was even. Then U.N.B. scored. Thus ended the fast half. In the second half U.N.B. scored once. The play was much evener than in the first half and the excitement at times was intense. However no further score was made, and the game ended Mt. Allison three U.N.B. two. The Intercollegiate League is divided into two sections, the Nova Scotia section comprising St. Francis Xavier, Dalhousie and Acadia and the New Brunswick section comprising U.N.B., Mt. Allison and Windsor. St. Francis now hold the trophy and at present lead the Eastern League while Mt. Allison and U.N.B. are ties in the Western. The final play off between the leaders in each league takes place about the first of March.

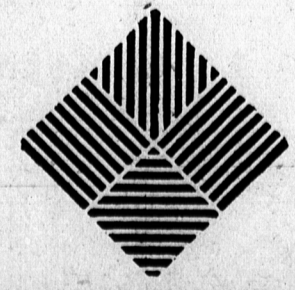

At a meeting of the Board of the Directors of the Charlottetown Driving Park and Provincial Exhibition Association held yesterday afternoon the Hon. F. L. Hazard who has been a director for many years and president of the association for the last ten years owing to his having been made Premier of the Province resigned his position as director of the association. The following resolution was passed by the Board of Directors: "Resolved that this Board on the retirement of its President the Hon. F. L. The dates of the Exhibition at Charlottetown this year, open to the Maritime Provinces, will be Sept. 22nd to 25th inclusive.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting sections reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section (25 acres, more or less).

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father or mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties unless one of the following plans:

- (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
- (2) A homesteader may, if so desired perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.
- (3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a home stead entered for by him in the vicinity such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).
- (4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowance crossed in the measurement.
- (5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents and on or farming land owned by himself must notify the Agency for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
