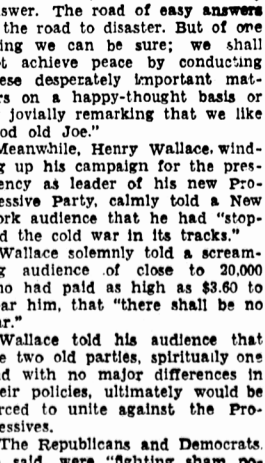
Egg Receipts Higher Than For Last Year
