### FRANCO-AMERICAN TRADE WAR ON

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—The application of the maximum rates of the French tariff to American products now enjoying the benefit of minimum rates, will represent an increase of from 33 to 201 per cent according to a statement of the bureau of manufacturers.

When the existing commercial agreement between France and the United States terminated at the end of the present month, certain products of France which have enjoyed the minimum rates of the Dingley law from getting the benefit of the minimum rates of the Payne law will be subjected to increased duty ranging from 29 to 60 per cent.

The increases on various American articles substantially are as follows: Manufactured and prepared pork meats, 100 per cent; canned meats, 33 per cent; lard, 60 per cent; fresh table fruits, 200 per cent; dried or pressed fruit, 70; paying blocks, 43 per cent; staves, 67 per cent; 100 per cent; heavy oils and residues of petroleum, 33 per cent.

The increases on French products in the main are as follows: On brandies, 49 per cent; on still wines and vermouths, 29 per cent; on champagne and all other sparkling wines, 60 per cent.

The imports into the United States from France of dutiable articles during the fiscal year of 1908, amounted to \$12,173,481.

The French imports from the United States during the same period aggregated \$21,021,220.

#### TWO FISHERMEN RESCUED ON BANKS.

LIVERPOOL, N. S., Oct. 30.—Captain McCuish, of the fishing schooner Gossip, that arrived here yesterday from the Banks reports that on October twenty two, he picked up two of the crew of the schooner Lillian, Capt Malone. The men had strayed from the vessel. They are being cared for by the American Counsel. The schooner Gossip came in for repairs having split her rudder post.

#### NEW MANAGER FOR UNION BANK, WINDSOR.

WINDSOR, N. S., Oct. 30.—An important change is about to take place in the position of manager of the Union Bank here. R. C. Wright, is promoted to St John, to be the manager of the Union Bank there. Mr Wright has been the manager of the Union Bank here for about five years, being the second manager of it in Windsor, succeeding Charles A. Gray. Mr Wright is very popular with the Windsorians, who will universally regret his departure. Such citizens no town can afford to lose. The new manager will be J. W. Cameron, of New Glasgow, who will come here from Glace Bay.

#### SCORE KILLED IN COLLIERY AT WALES

LONDON, Oct. 30.—A score of men were killed by an explosion in the Raynham Colliery at Glamorganshire, the most easterly County of Wales yesterday. Manager Brown and two companies attempted a rescue were themselves overcome by the after-damp and perished.

#### SENTENCED FOR SERIOUS CRIME

TORONTO, October 30.—James Robinson was acquitted at the "Bud" very late of the murder of his daughter's illegitimate child after he had been found guilty of rape and incest against his own daughter and sentenced to 18 years in Kingston Penitentiary on the three charges. The feature of the case was the evidence of his Robinson, wife of the prisoner, based under sentence for the murder of the child.

#### HESTIA WRECK CONDEMNED.

ST. JOHN, October 30.—A survey of the Donaldson Liner "Hestia," on Old Proprietor Ledge, was made yesterday, and she was adjudged a total loss. It is possible, however, that a portion of the cargo may be saved, and an attempt to get ashore was made today, if the weather permits. Since the Hestia struck on Monday, the sea has been too rough to permit of anyone getting close to the wreck.

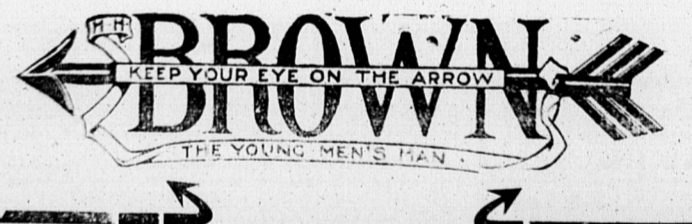

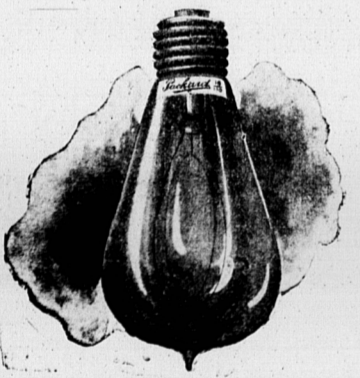

EARL CREWE MAY BE GOVERNOR-GENERAL. OTTAWA, Oct. 29.—The cable announcement from London that Canada's Governor General is likely to be a member of the Asquith Cabinet is taken in well informed circles here to refer to the present Colonial Secretary Earl Crewe. It is believed here that he would be the most likely first choice of the Imperial Government as the successor to Earl Grey if he desires the position. Earl Crewe is a son-in-law of Lord Rosebery, and even if the Unionist Party should come into power next year in Britain, the Colonial Secretary would still be a not improbable choice for the Canadian Governorship. His appointment, or that of Lord Morley who is also mentioned for the position, would be well received here.

YOUNGSTER TURNS UP IN SAFETY. ST CATHERINES, Oct. 30.—Because the man she was driving with got drunk and she was afraid of him, 12 year-old Flossie Ferguson, a Toronto girl, sought protection in a nearby farmhouse, and this caused her relatives and the police of several cities no end of worry.

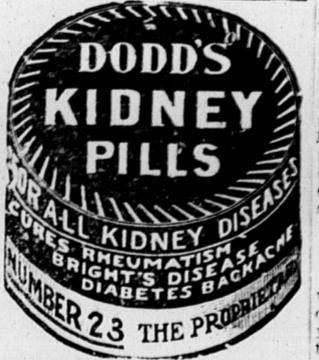

#### ANOTHER WRECK RECORDED.

HALIFAX, October 30.—Wreckage washed ashore on the rocky coast of South Cape Breton indicates that still another tragedy of the sea was enacted in the gulf that swept the North Atlantic Coast the first of this week. A portion of the masts and deck, evidently of a large vessel, were tossed on the shore at Louisburg yesterday.

Wreckage was also seen by the Keeper of the Louisburg Light. From what indicated craft this comes there is no means of knowing, but the three already known to have met an end in the recent past.

#### GOVERNMENT HAS DECLINED.

OTTAWA, October 30.—The Government, after considering the proposals of the capitalists, as presented on Tuesday last, respecting Federal yards at Lewis and shipbuilding yards at St John, has come to the conclusion that the request for an annual subsidy of 4 per cent for 50 years on the total contemplated six million dollars is too large. While fully recognizing the importance of the undertaking, the Government believed that so large a subsidy is not justified, and that another measure of Federal aid should be sufficient.

Failing the decision of the Company to agree to build dry docks and shipbuilding plants unless the full measure of the request is complied with, it is hoped some other Company will undertake the establishment of a great Canadian shipbuilding industry.

#### GRAIN EXCHANGES IN U. S. INTERESTS.

CHICAGO, Oct. 30.—A Board of Trade committee is arranging a federation of grain exchanges. This is the outcome of much recent discussion of the need and value of such an organization in the United States. There appears to be no doubt that a much better working basis in the grain trade will be the present step, and that the advantages and facilities conferred by the new order of things will be very pronounced. It has been stated several times recently by competent authorities here, that there is a desire in Canada for a like linking of the various exchanges there, and the establishing of a headquarters for the receipt and communication of various information. This, it is felt, will soon materialize into some definite action. Should such a scheme dominate there is a possibility that the two confederations thus formed will seek to be more or less identified in their business relations.
