Fixed Bayonets

Seen in London

(By Dominion News Service.) LONDON, Aug. 18.—Dominion visitors exploring the territory of the Lord Mayor on the morning of July 30 were privileged to see one of London's many little pageants—the marching of a full battalion of the Grenadier Guards through the streets of "the City" with bayonets fixed and colors uncase, a right way from Waterloo Station to the Tower, having just come up from Pirbright Camp. The Tower, it must be remembered, is not merely a wonderful relic of the past, but a present-day arsenal, with a garrison, for which there is plenty of room within its thirteen-acre enclosure. This garrison must not be confused with the body of about 100 "beetleaters," or Yeoman Warders, one of whose functions is to act as guides to visitors.

Claims Secret of Sex Determination

(By Dominion News Service)

LONDON, August 16.—Mrs. Monteth Erskine, wife of Mr. J. M. Erskine, M. P. for the St. George's Division of Westminster, claims to have discovered the secret of sex determination.

Hundreds of women are said to have used with success the knowledge she has acquired, and she now discloses to the press how she solved the riddle which has been the subject of research among scientists for years.

Her husband, J. M. Erskine says that Mrs. Erskine solved the problem twenty years ago. She has kept it secret for various reasons. "In the past people did not discuss matters of this kind openly as they do now. Women in particular shrank from the very mention of sex and all that concerns it. Hundreds of women have used, and used with complete success, the knowledge that Mrs. Erskine acquired and put at their disposal. But they swore her to secrecy, which even without the vow she would have observed.

"Many an heir to title and great estates owes his very existence to the instructions bestowed upon his mother by his wife, but those instructions have remained a secret between the two.

"Today we are more enlightened. Men and women can discuss those matters openly and decently.

Considering the enormous national importance of being able to encourage the production of male babies in place of female it would be unpatriotic to hide any longer the knowledge possessed by Mrs. Erskine.

Encouraged by her husband's presence and words, Mrs. Erskine conquered the difference with which at first she approached the subject, and gave a long and complete account of her theory and recommendations.

"My interest in sex questions began," said Mrs. Erskine, "when I studied medicine as a girl. Now I am a woman with grown-up sons and a daughter and I may tell you that it is no mere chance that my family consists of one girl and three boys.

"The girl came first, and after that I decided to have sons. I had two sons once, and knew that I was going to have them with such certainty that my husband insured heavily against twins, and the insurance was, of course, paid.

"Only a woman can really solve sex questions. There are innumerable things that must be felt in person to be known or understood. Doctors and men of science have floundered hopelessly. It has been left for a comparatively ignorant woman like myself, helped by her own feelings and by long observations of animals and of human beings, to read 'Nature's answer to the question. How shall I have a boy?'—and, as always with great natural question, the answer is very simple.

"I have a formula which I provide to women who consult me, and which has never failed. Women who have consulted her. There is no doubt of her complete sincerity and of her ardent desire to help her country and her fellow-women.

"My knowledge of dairy farming and the breeding of cattle helped me in my discovery, but hardly as much as the talks I have had with women of every kind and of every position about their confinements and everything to do with their experiences of conception and of birth. These are talks that no man could ever have had.

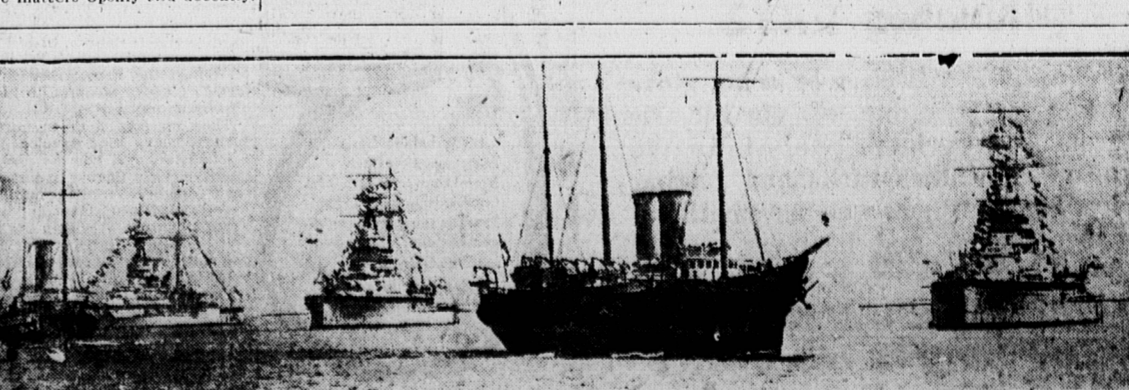
"For years I have lost no opportunity of learning from every woman I met or saw who was enceinte. I can tell now at a glance whether the baby will be born a boy or a girl.

"Doctors have their minds too full of other things to notice simple facts which have become plain to me. No body can influence the sex of a child once it has started. But it can be determined beforehand by the possession of a little definite knowledge.

"The sex of every egg exists before it is fertilised. And the ovary on each side produces only eggs of one sex. The ovaries work alternately, and between their months of work there is a fruitless month. Conception is only probably when the right day of the right month is chosen for intercourse. And the sex of the infant conceived will depend on which ovary has been at work last.

"There you have in a few words the most important rudiments of my doctrine.
