

# Wheeler's Take Royals Into Camp 10-5

## Big, Heavy Moncton Team Shoot Eight Goals In 2nd Period To Take Big Lead

A tireless, fast skating band of Wheelers from Moncton last night took a strange hold on the New Brunswick-P. E. I. Junior hockey crown when they roared from behind a 3 goal deficit to defeat the Junior Royals 10-5 and take their five goal lead into the second and final game to be played in New Brunswick on Tuesday next.

Displaying a fast passing attack that continually clicked, Wheelers after seeing the Royals shoot three goals in the first eight minutes of the game, came back to shoot two before the session ended and then taking complete control of the play shot eight markers into the losers net to take a 10-4 lead at the end of the middle session. Royals scored the only goal of the third period as they fought doggedly and hard in their losing effort.

Scoring ten times during the encounter young Benson Auld in the Royals cage nevertheless turned out to be one of the stars of the game. The kid hadn't a chance on the ice until he drove that small crowd to his feet as he made miraculous saves from two turnable angle shots. They went down fighting like the champions and although they will take today down five goals they will take a last ditch stand when they meet the Moncton team in the second game next week.

Moncton bigger and faster stormed the Royals net as the game got underway but Auld in the Royals cage was too good for them and gradually Royals started to make a penalty to Tisdale followed by penalties to Gaudet and McDougall was the signal for the losers of the game that netted them three goals in the space of thirty seconds. A penalty to Tisdale started it off and he went in alone at 7:12. Eight seconds later the shifty centremen was in again for his second goal and 31 seconds after that Jackson took a relay from Hodgson to make the Royals however took back made and got their opening score as with Kelly in the cooler for tripping Carter scored on a pass from Peppin. Peppin was enjoying a rest as his winners scored their second goal Cormier getting it on a pass from Gaudet, just twelve seconds before the session ended.

Wheelers again opening fast started their eight goal scoring spree two minutes from the start of the second period. Tower got the first, less than two minutes later Drisdelle took a pass from Cormier to shoot the Monctonians ahead. 4-3. Drisdelle and Cormier combined again for goal number five. Kelly from Carter was the scoring end of the new Moncton goal. Royals had a tough break on the same when the puck glanced in to the cage from a Royals player's body, Carter getting credit for the counter. J. Cormier from Drisdelle got the eighth. Moncton tally. Whitlock came through with another goal less than four minutes before the end of the session but before the period ended Wheelers had shot two more to take a 10-4 lead.

As game as they come Royals came out to take the offensive in the third period but the best they could do was get one counter. Whitlock drilling it home at 17:08. Wide open the Royals were continually caught by the fast-breaking Moncton team but Auld stood in the breach to hold them at bay.

The game did not get underway until nearly midnight due to the late arrival of the train and as a result it was 1:30 this morning before it was completed.
