THREE cases which came before the Stipendiary yesterday for violation of the C. T. A. were postponed until Saturday the 14th for further evidence.

SUMMERSIDE streets are blocked as they have not been during the winter. The snowstorm of Friday night and Saturday was the heaviest in years. The country roads are also badly blocked.

CAPT. BENOIT with Schooner Evelyn has accepted another fish freight from St. John's, Newfoundland, from which port he sailed on the 2nd inst., for Operto, Portugal, from which place he returns in ballast to load his Brazil freight.

REV. W. M. Smith, formerly pastor of Zion Church, Ferrona, but now pastor of the Presbyterian Church, Summerside, P. E. I., is resting at his home here for a couple of weeks. His church is undergoing some repairs, while he himself has not fully recovered from his recent illness. —New Glasgow Bulletin.

THE engine and snow plough of the train from the west were derailed in a snow drift between Wellington and Miscouche yesterday morning. A train went up from here in the afternoon and brought down the mails and passengers arriving here about 4.30 when it proceeded to Charlottetown.

THE Stanley left here yesterday about 2.30 p. m. for Charlottetown, Capt. George Clark, piloting her. There was no difficulty whatever with ice nor with the depth of the water although she was apparently heavily ballasted. It is hoped that her entry and departure at about half tide will remove once for all any doubt that may be entertained as to whether there is sufficient depth of water in Summerside Harbor to accommodate her. The harbor is now practically opened although there is still enough ice to prevent the Northumberland attempting it. With the first northerly or easterly wind it is expected the ice will finally disappear.

THE regular monthly meeting of the Town Council was held last night, the Mayor and all the councillors present. After routine and passing of bills a letter was read from Mrs. Reid complaining that a cess pool in the vicinity of the Russ Hotel was a nuisance and asked that the matter should be remedied. After discussion the police were instructed to have the nuisance removed. The tender of Arch McDonald for hauling the fire engine Beaver for \$55 was accepted. A number of applications for the position of policeman were read, including one from Mr. George E. Hippenstall containing a somewhat exhaustive autobiography. It was moved by Coun. Goss seconded by Coun. Brace that the application of D. W. Henderson, North Wiltshire as policeman and prosecutor at \$55 per month be accepted. Coun. Morris did not approve of the appointment of a new man over the head of those now in office. He thought that if the present employees did not do their duty satisfactorily they should be told so and he had no doubt that any complaints, if they existed would be removed. He did not approve of going outside of the town to look for a policeman, unless it was absolutely necessary. Coun. Brace said that the objection that the applicant was not a citizen had been true of those now on the police force. Personally he had no objection to Peters, now on the force, but the present council was elected to make a change and he thought it desirable that this change be made. The motion was put and carried. Councillors Brace, Kirk, Grady and Goss, voting for it, Morris and McNeill against it. The Mayor thought that the action of the council was hasty, particularly in view of the fact that some C. T. A. cases are now pending. Moved by Coun. Kirk seconded by Councillor Brace that Policeman McDonald be retained on the force. Motion carried. Moved by Coun. Goss, seconded by Coun. Brace that a policeman he appointed pro tem to fill the vacant position. A bill for \$17.50 from C.F. Parsons for loss of time and injury occasioned by being run over by the hose cart on the side walk at the time of the Russ Hotel fire. The matter was referred to a committee. Mr. H. J. Massey was appointed wharfinger and Mr. W. G. Schurman collector of wharfage on goods coming by the S. S. Compagna. A satisfactory report was given by the Fire Warden. A discussion followed on repairs to Water St. This matter was left over to be further considered at a meeting next Monday night. The usual by-law fixing the poll-tax at \$2.00 was passed.
