THE members of Hamilton L. O. Lodge attended divine service in the Baptist Church at Clyde River on Sabbath last. Rev. A. F. Brown preached a very acceptable sermon from Galatians 5, "Stand fast therefore in the Liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free and be not Entangled Again with the Yoke of Bondage." By the excellent attention of his hearers the congregation drank in the truths as they came from the preacher's lips, like pure water from a boiling spring—pure and holy. All through the discourse it seemed as if he was full from head to foot of loyalty to God, King and country. In a very forcible manner he pointed out that true liberty is liberty of belief, liberty of action and liberty of conscience. In standing to maintain this priceless heritage the Orange Association contends for loyalty to God, loyalty to country, and undying hatred to any form of slavery whether secular or religious. He said no matter what form of religion a man wished to profess, Presbyterian, Methodist, Baptist or Roman Catholic, the Orange Association would stand by that man and see that he be allowed to serve God according to the dictates of his own conscience, none daring to make him afraid. A service of this kind is an educator that will have its effect for years to come. Time alone will tell the amount of good it will do, shaping the hearts and minds of those who in a few years will fill our pulpits and legislative halls. Such talks as these have made the British nation what it is to-day, a power on the earth, all founded on an open Bible the emblem of the Orange Association. Long may Rev. Mr. Brown live to be an instructor of the young and rising generation, to sow such good seed that is sure to bring forth good fruit. After an earnest appeal to the members to live lives worthy of their noble Association and praise and prayer to the Most High for His blessings the service was brought to a close.
