TO MAKE IRONING EASY.

When a woman does her own ironing she should first make sure that she is dressed comfortably. A looser and thinner blouse than usual is of much advantage in the warm work.

An old flannel sheet is a very good thing to tack on the ironing-board, with a light cotton one for the removable one, as it can be easily washed. A piece of beeswax tied up in a rag, to rub quickly over the bottom of a dutton will keep it smooth and insure its gliding over the clothes, regularly, especially if they are starched ones.

NEW BEADED STOCKINGS.

Paris has adopted the beaded stockings and from there it has been imported to this country. The new ideas are indeed stunning and most unusual. The beads are placed on the lace insertions or put directly on the plain silk stocking, according to the wishes of the wearer. They are also embroidered in any color to please the wearer, or to match the color of the gown. The beads are both large and small, silver, steel and gold being used. Others are made of the colored woods and jet is much used in the darker decorations.

Many of the patterns are light and of a lacy design. They last a long time, as all the work is done by hand. Plain silk stockings, black, of a fine quality are embroidered in imitation pearls, the little beads being put on in straight lines, five or seven rows up and down the instep. Small brilliants are occasionally added to the embroidery, either at regular intervals or at the end of a row. A great deal of gold and silver is used on the colored stockings put on in rows of insertion or in a single large piece over the instep.

SENSIBLE RULES ABOUT NURSING THE SICK.

Never let patient see you are annoyed about anything. Never whisper in the sick room. Speak in a low tone and on cheerful subjects. Don't relate painful experiences. Never startle patient with dreadful things you read. Write down time to give medicine, foods, etc. Keep room bright unless the doctor ordered darkened. Keep everything in order. Don't leave unfastened food by patient; that would prevent patient from taking any food. Don't be fussy and bustling. Let the air of the room be as pure as possible. Don't sweep, wipe everything with a damp cloth. Carry out all vessels covered. Don't leave beef tea or stimulants where they can be smelled. Wear light-colored clothing.

CARE OF THE HAIR.

A mistaken idea many women have is that oily applications make the hair greasy. They do not, when the scalp requires them, unless the lotion is applied in undue quantity, which is, of course, useless. In applying oil to the scalp there is precisely the same difference that exists in watering a plant judiciously and doing it so the soil become muddy. Without water the plant will die, but too much will also kill it. When oil is required the skin will take it as the soil soaks water.

Singing or clipping the ends of the hair is extremely necessary once in a while for its best health. Precisely how often it shall be done depends upon the condition of the scalp, for hair differs greatly, some splitting almost immediately after treatment, while on the head of another person it may remain in good condition for several months. When the ends split, each hair dividing itself in two, it invariably indicates lack of nourishment from the scalp and deadness of the ends. Obviously then to remove it is the only course.

The King's private secretary, the Marquis de Lavradio, is already in residence in Richmond, and on Saturday the Lord Chamberlain and lady-in-waiting on the Queen-mother, arrived at the Crown's Nest, Queen's Road, which they have taken furnished.

It would be hard to imagine a greater contrast to the long lines and dignified proportions of the Palace of the Necessidades at Lisbon, with its parks and gardens, than the unpretentious house which is to be the King Manoel's home for the present. It stands on the crest of the hill in a thoroughfare running from the Sheen Road in the direction of the park. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must be in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
